

Snapshot Report User Guide

This report provides a summary of the data collected and aggregated from all schools that have completed at least one School Health Index assessment (SHI) (i.e. all items identified on the Healthy Schools Program website as **required questions** in the six modules outlined below and across the Nutrition and Physical Activity Topics).

The purpose of this guide is to provide an overview of each table and graph in the report.

- HSP's in District – the number of schools in the district that are working with the Healthy Schools Program either onsite or online.
- Onsite HSP Count – total number of schools in the district participating in the Healthy Schools Program through the onsite model
- Online HSP Count – total number of schools in the district participating in the Healthy Schools Program through the Online model or Let's Move Active Schools Program.

Schools: This table presents the total number of schools that are enrolled in the Healthy Schools Program, broken down by program participation type. **Onsite** schools are those receiving support from a Program Manager. **Online** schools include those engaging via the Healthy Schools Program website as a Team Member (meaning they are able to edit the assessment and action plan) or as a Fan (meaning they can only view without making any edits), as well as any schools engaging solely through the LMAS program. The percentage of schools enrolled out of all schools in the nation, state or district is also included. The total number of schools could include preschools and/or alternative schools which may not be eligible to participate fully in the Healthy Schools Program.



Percentage of items fully met on current assessments


Percentage of Items Fully Met on Current Assessments



This graph compares the total number of assessment items fully implemented (marked as a "3") on the most recent SHI assessment by module or topic to the total number of assessment items that **could be fully implemented** for all schools with a completed assessment by module or topic within the district, state, or nation. If a school selected a 0, 1, or 2 for any item, that would be considered incomplete. This percentage can also be seen in the Module Summaries section as the "Total" for current assessment responses fully meeting. This comparison does not take into consideration the differences in required questions for various school levels.

This graph compares the total number of action items **selected and in progress** by module or topic to the total number of action items that **could be selected** for all schools with an action plan by module or topic within the district, state, or nation. For example, if a district has 22 HSP schools and 22 of those schools have action plans, we would calculate the action items selected in the Health Education module as follows:

Number of schools with action plans: 22
 Number of Health Education criteria*: 7
 Number of HE action items selected by all 22 schools*: 8
 Number of HE action items completed by all 22 schools*: 3
 Percentage of schools with action items in progress: 5.3* $[8 / (22 \times 7) - 3 \text{ OR } 8 / 151 = 5.3\%]$

This table highlights the percentage of schools that are currently meeting the bronze, silver or gold criteria for a National Healthy Schools Award eligibility in each module. This is based on the schools' most recently completed SHI assessments and does not take into account whether a school has applied for or been awarded with a National Healthy Schools Award, which may impact eligibility.

Question #: corresponds with the question number in the SHI.

Question: Provides a summary of the question in the SHI.

Award Level: The award level to which the question applies. Note that all bronze level questions apply for Silver and Gold eligibility. Likewise, all silver questions apply for Gold eligibility.

Responses fully meeting: The percentage of schools fully meeting the assessment item when answering the question most recently (i.e. it could be the baseline or a follow-up response).

Times Selected: Number of schools in the district that added the action item to their action plan.

Times Completed: Number of times schools in the district marked this action item completed on their action plan.

Selection Rank: Provides a ranking of the most popular action items identified by schools in this district. It is determined looking at the highest number of times selected in the times selected column. The
