



KINDERGARTEN


Greeting RRDS 2nd Grade Parents and Guardians,






Math

Our focus will be graphing information, continuing elapsed time word problems, comparing fractions, and solving 2-step word problems.

We have practiced using a timeline to organize our start and end times, then found the elapsed time between the two.

** I greatly appreciate every parent, grandparent, and sibling assisting the learning of our third graders. All writing should be in the student's handwriting. This allows their brain to process new information for long term memory.

What is happening in 4th Grade?

Reading: lessons in describing text structures (cause-effect, compare-contrast, chronological, and problem-solution). We will be learning about the differences between first- and secondhand accounts of events.

Ensure you child continues to read independently at home with the extra reading materials (Scholastic news, Science and Social Studies Newsletter, Leading the Way, etc.) I send home and utilize the Tumblebooks-www.tumblebookslibrary.com online. Have your child record their reading on their reading log.

Math-lessons in fluently add and subtract multi-digit whole numbers, use strategies and properties to multiply by 1-digit, and 2-digit numbers.

Ensure your child practices and knows his or her math facts in addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. One of the best ways to have your child know the facts is to practice daily. You can use games, flashcards, versatiles, and online math games.

Science-continue lessons in Earth and Space Science "Weather" and "Energy and Ecosystems"

Social Studies-lessons in Americans and Their History

Navajo Language and Culture-lesson in basic Navajo words through visual, pronunciation, practice, and saying the words focus on four directions and Navajo Nation Government.

Thank you for supporting your child by helping him or her with the learning support kit and returning the assigned work to the school for grading. Please call or text me, if your child needs help or have any questions.




