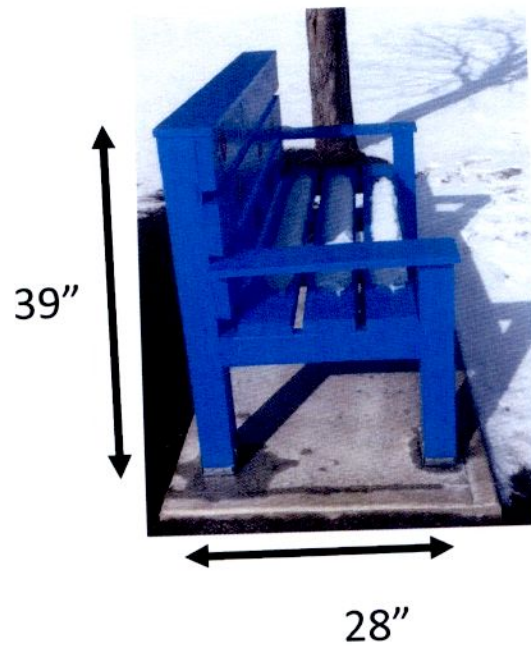
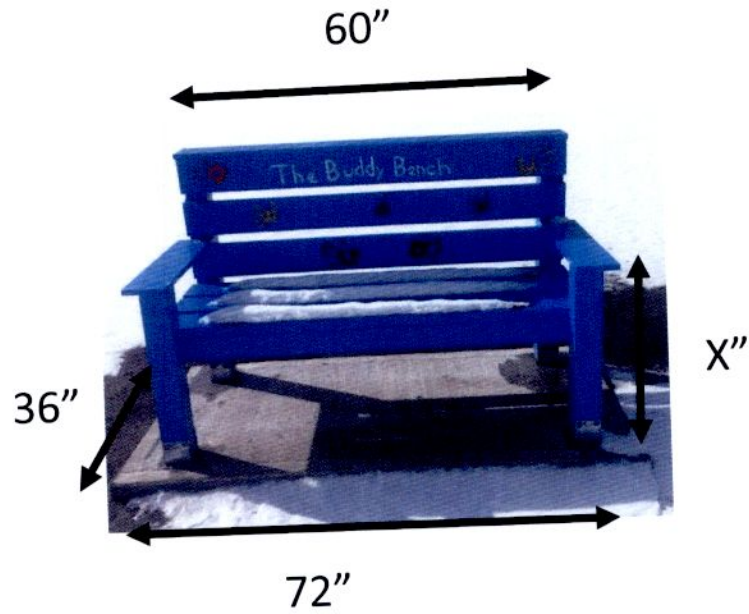

Buddy Bench



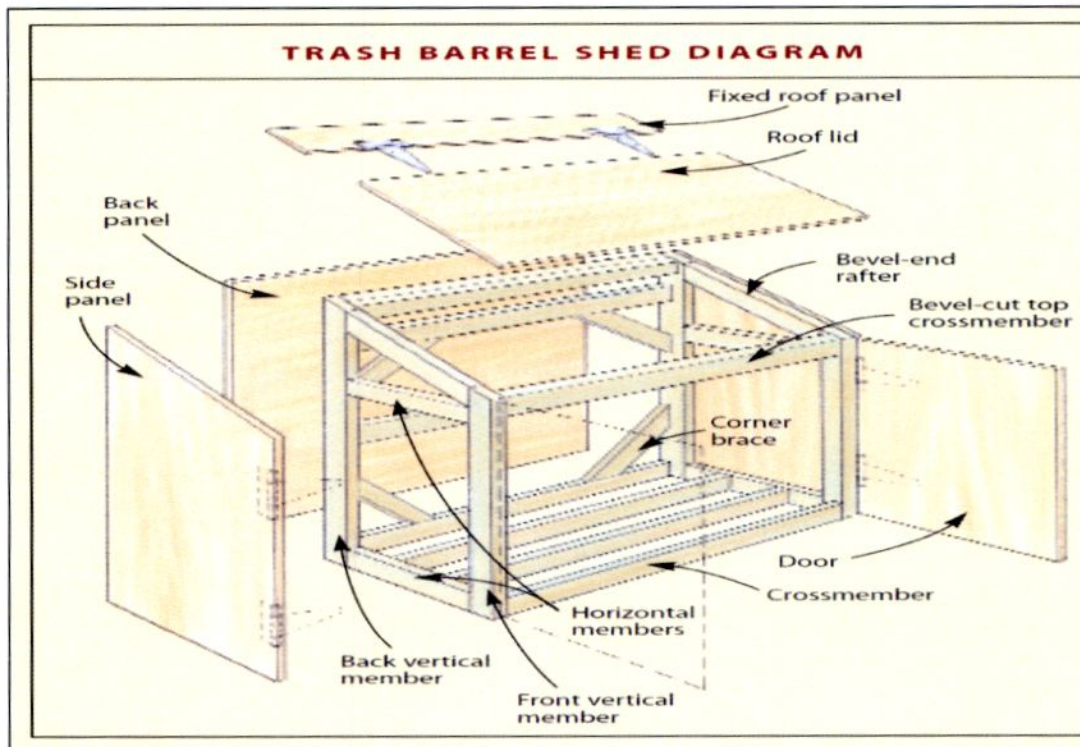

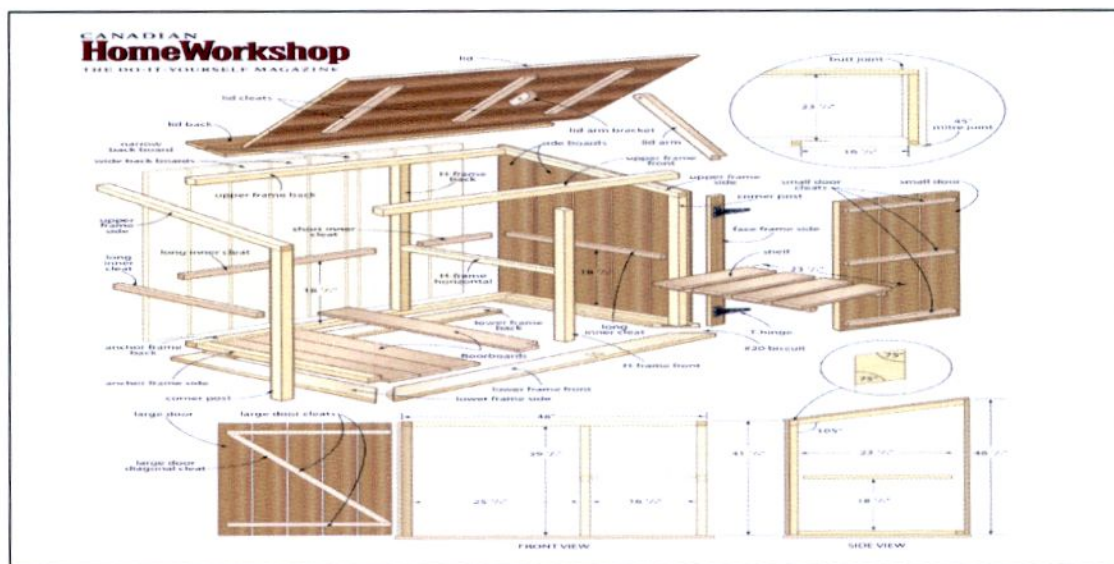
Storage Shed

TOOLS & MATERIALS ✨

What to Buy

1) 2 × 4 PRESSURE-TREATED LUMBER. The non-toxic treatment outweighs the slight price premium. You'll need eight 8-ft. pieces to satisfy the Lumber List (below).

2) T-111 SIDING. Sold in 4-ft. by 8-ft. panels; try to match or complement your home's existing exterior finishes. You'll need three panels for the project.

3) SHEATHING PANELS. Buy one 4-ft. by 8-ft. sheet of 5/8-in. exterior-grade plywood for the roof lid and doors.

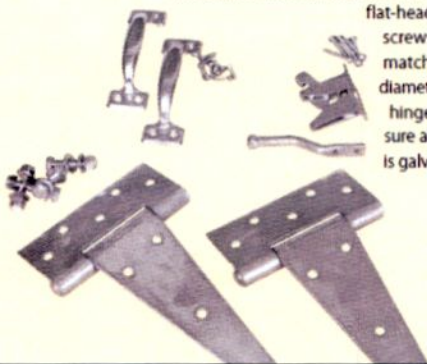
4) FASTENERS AND ADHESIVE. You'll need small boxes of 10d common nails, 2-in. wood or deck screws, and roofing nails plus a dozen 2-in. lag screws. You'll need a tube or two of waterproof construction adhesive, as well.

5) PRIMER AND PAINT. Use an exterior-grade latex primer and paint that matches or complements the color of your home's exterior finish. A quart of primer and a gallon of paint should be more than enough for two coats.

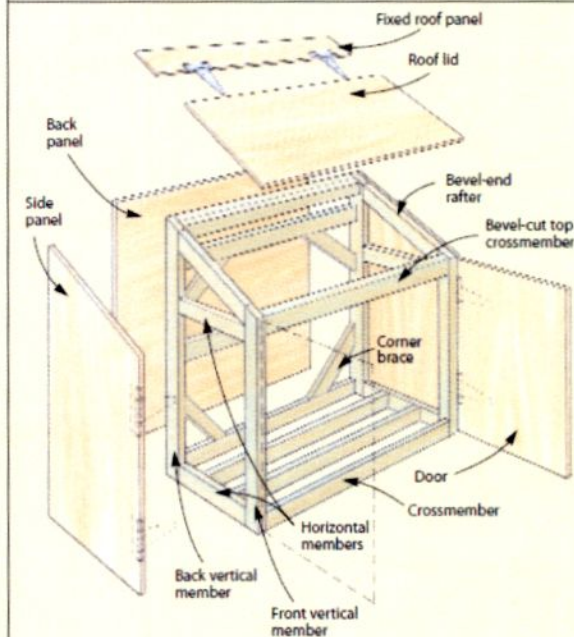
6) ROOFING. Use materials compatible with your home's roof materials; you'll need enough for a 4-ft. by 3-ft. surface. Get a metal drip edge, too.

7) HARDWARE. You'll need six 3 1/2-in. T-hinges, a pair of door pulls, and a latch or hasp for the doors. Buy four dozen 3/4-in.

flat-head bolts, nuts, and washers and a dozen screws that are matched to the diameter of the hinges' holes. Make sure all the hardware is galvanized.

Lumber list

Qty.	Desc.	Dimensions
2	Back vertical members	2 in. × 4 in. × 54 in. (at their highest point; mark and cut 30° angles at the top—see Step 1, p. 70).
2	Front vertical members	2 in. × 4 in. × 42 in. (cut 30° angles at top)
4	Horizontal members	2 in. × 4 in. × 17 in.
2	Rafters	2 in. × 4 in. × 27 in. (mark and cut each end at parallel 40° angles—see Step 1, p. 70).
3	Top crossmembers	2 in. × 4 in. × 43 1/4 in. (bevel top edge 30°)
6	Crossmembers	2 in. × 4 in. × 43 1/4 in.
4	Corner braces	2 in. × 4 in. × 18 in. (cut 45° angles on each end)
2	Side panels	24 in. × 60 in. T-111 plywood (cut to fit)
1	Back panel	48 in. × 54 in. T-111 plywood (cut to fit exact dimensions before fastening to the frame members)
