Fairview Science Night – Thursday, September 24

Join us for hands-on learning experiences. The MySci van is returning. Dinner is offered by Bobo's Pizza in the cafeteria starting at 4:30 p.m. Science activities will begin at 5:30 p.m. in the gym. Check out what Fairview students are studying in their day-to-day science classes.

- Kindergarten students are studying plants and animals. Ask about the parts of a plant.
- First Grade students are learning about the life cycle of frogs, birds, and butterflies.
- Second Grade students can describe how seeds travel.
- Third Grade students are learning about change over time. They are also writing a "how-to manual" for planting seeds.
- Fourth Grade students can explain how changes in any part of a habitat can impact plants and animals. Ask about food webs.
- Fifth Grade students are learning to classify animals. They will be building a diorama of an ecosystem including plants and animals that could survive in the same environment and who would, together, support one another in a food web.
- Sixth Grade are extending the learning about adaptations of plants and animals.
