a) Econ	<ul> <li>on and Possible Action Items</li> <li>omics Curriculum:</li> <li>Mr. Mulvihill opened the discussion by stating that 2 years ago, the BOE asked that the Economics course be re-instated. The old course was revisited and revised. Mrs. Racey and Ms. Andrews made many revisions to bring it up to date. Mr. Mulvihill thanked them for their patience and diligence.</li> <li>Mrs. Racey explained that the target student for this course is a general level student. Topics such as budgeting money and taxes are presented as everyday economics with a hands-on approach.</li> <li>Mr. Failla questioned how much emphasis would be placed on global economics.</li> <li>Mrs. Racey explained that global economics are imbedded throughout the History curriculum and Ms. Andrews added that financial newspapers are available for class use and some discussion takes place as current events dictate. <ul> <li>c) SAT Prep Semester Course Discussion:</li> <li>Mr. Mulvihill stated that on the new SAT scores are down across the country as well as in Connecticut. Verbal scores are down 20 points, Math 10 points, with the Writing component difficult to judge because it is so new – there isn't enough history yet with this test.</li> <li>Mr. Mulvihill believes that a prep course imbedded in the school day that also addresses curriculum could benefit more students.</li> <li>This course is designed to be a half year course and would dove-tail with the Junior year half year Civics course. It could be scheduled in sections of 30, would offer another elective, and would help ease scheduling for many levels of students. Credit would be awarded in the general elective area.</li> <li>The cost of this program is estimated at \$8,000 with \$5,000 of that total being invested in materials. There would also be a professional development piece, with teachers being trained in timed-test management techniques, content area tricks and other specific test-taking skills. Students in this course will not take practice tests everyday but will be offered more opportunities to practice test than normal.</li> <li>A small percentage of colleges do not require SAT results but students are allowed to submit them as part of their application. The ACT test is more widely accepted in the Western and Southern colleges but the SAT test is still used more widely.</li> <li>Mr. Lawson asked if this course could be ready to go for next year's courses, both he and Mr. Mulvihill feel that a course proposal could be ready for the March BOE meeting.</li> </ul>	SAT Prep Semester Course Discussion
