(This standard shall not restrict the acceptance of gifts or tokens offered and accepted openly from students, patents, or other persons or organizations in recognition or appreciation of service.)

## Standard 9: Maintenance of Confidentiality

An educator shall comply with state and federal laws and local school board policies relating to confidentiality of student school board policies relating to confidentiality of student and other unformation covered by confidentiality agreements

- a Keeping in confidence information about students that has been obtained in the course of professional service unless disclosure serves a legitimate purpose or is required by law
- b Maintaining diligently the security of standardized test supplies and resources
- 9.2. Unethical conduct includes, but is not limited to, the following
- a Sharing confidential information concerning student academic and disciplinary records, health and medical information family status/income and assessment/testing results unless disclosure is required or permitted by law.
- b Violating confidentiality agreements related to standardized testing including copying or teaching identified test items, publishing or distributing test items or answers, discussing test items, and violating local school board or state directions for the use of tests
- Violating other confidentiality agreements required by state or local policy.

### Standard 10: Breach of Contract or Abandonment of Employment

An educator should fulfill all of the terms and obligations detailed in the contract with the local school board or educational agency for the duration of the contract.

- Unethical conduct includes, but is not limited to, the following:
- a Abandoning the contract for professional services without prior release from the contract by the school board
- b Refusing to perform services required by the contract.

This code shall apply to all persons licensed according to the rules established by the Mississippi State Boof Education and protects the health, safety and general welfare of students and educators.

Ethical conduct is any conduct which promots the health, safety, welfare, discipline and morals of students and colleagues.

Unethical conduct is any conduct that impairs the license holder's ability to function in his/her employment position or a pattern of behavior if at detrimental to the health, safety, welfare, discipling morals of students and colleagues.

Any educator or administrator license may be re ok or suspended for engaging in unethical conduct relations to an educator/student relationship (Standard 4).

Superintendents shall report to the Mississippi Depart of Education license holders who engage in unethic conduct relating to an educator/student relation shifts (Standard 4).
