masks are not available, appropriate solid colored or printed face masks made with at least 2 layers of breathable material which fit snugly, yet comfortably against the side of the face (cover nose, mouth, and secure under the chin) are acceptable. Masks with inappropriate or political messages or innuendos are not permitted and subject to administrators' sole discretion. Neck gaiters, open-chin triangle bandanas and face coverings containing valves, mesh material, or holes of any kind including those in N95 and other similar masks are **not** acceptable."
