WAO Enhancing Use of Technology Tools

"It's going to be life changing for some of my students — pretty exciting!" says Mary Stanislawski, a Warren-Alvarado-Oslo High School teacher about the many learning possibilities of one of the latest new personal computer devices, the Apple iPad.

Stanislawski's enthusiasm, expressed near the end of a day filled with new technology updating for WAO teachers, staff and school board members, echoed the comments of several other teachers of the district who were impressed by the way students in many schools already are using iPads and other new technology tools to more effectively achieve learning goals.

The hands-on orientation into new educational applications for iPads, laptop computers and similar devices and supporting software came on Monday, November 8 and included separate focused sessions for elementary and high school, as well as the district's technology committee and school board members. Presenting the wealth of information and new ideas were Paul Musegades and two colleagues from the Twin Cities office of Apple computer corporation.

A typical comment from teacher participants in the day's mini-course on the educational possibilities of the new technologies was that they felt filled to the tops of their heads with ideas, impressions and the desire to learn much more. Another typical comment, voiced by Superintendent Bryan Thygeson and others, is that WAO, generally, is at the "we don't know what we don't know stage" regarding the newest technology developments.

To move forward effectively from this point, the district is planning a number of highly effective learning experiences for teachers and administrators alike. These already have included a sort of jump-start session for several educators from WAO who visited the Apple world headquarters in Cupertino, Calif., several months ago, an eye-opening experience that spurred on the current quest for greater use of technology tools at WAO. In December, several from WAO will participate in the TIES Conference in Minneapolis, one of the biggest exhibitions of technology integration into K-12 education in the world.

Both in connection with TIES and at later opportunities, selected WAO teachers will be visiting Minnesota schools that are already successfully putting iPads or similar devices into the hands of students for delivery of the schools' curriculums. Some of the schools being considered for tours are using a "1-to-1" model, meaning each student has a permanently assigned device. In other

schools being considered for visits, the devices are shared by the students on a check-out basis.

WAO wants to take a well-thought-out approach to fact-finding tours of other schools and, indeed, to the whole process of moving more actively into the use of technology tools. The district has had a planning structure in place for this kind of decision-making for some time. There is a technology committee in both the elementary and the high school, as well as a district-wide technology committee. In addition, the Quality Education Taskforce strives for a forward-leaning stance on matters dealing with the school learning environment, which includes incorporation of technology. Functioning as a sort of steering committee for the whole process in each building are the principals, Kirk Thorstenson in the elementary and Craig Peterson in the high school, along with Heidi Thorstenson, district technology coordinator, and the superintendent.

The QET is looking to the future in 3-, 5- and 10-year intervals. As an example of the kind of planning needed in that effort, Thygeson says the teachers and others must try to imagine what the high school curriculum will look like for today's third graders. Will there still be printed textbooks, or will a move to digital textbooks, already begun, be well advanced? What will media centers in the schools look like — shelves of books, or stations to download course content onto their iPads?

"It's out there," says Thygeson of the approaching wave of technology. "At WAO, we've got to be deliberate, know what we're looking for, take the time to look for the web-based programming that we can use and then incorporate some of those ideas into our 3-5-year planning."

Technology is not a new thing at WAO, of course. As with other area schools, personal computers began making their entrance into local education about three decades ago, and the advent of the Internet opened up a new world school leaders have wanted to make it possible for students to explore.

Mosaic Art

Schuler Scholarship Endowment Fund

An anonymous donor has come forward to support the Gary Schuler Scholarship Endowment Fund to the level of a \$5,000 match. The goal of the fund is to reach a total of \$25,000 so that an annual \$1,000 scholarship can be awarded to a graduating senior of Warren-Alvarado-Oslo. Steve Brekke, a former Pony great who helped lead the Ponies to their first-ever state basketball tournament appearance in 1979, is currently donating to the endowment. "I am excited to not only donate, but am honored to help raise donations for the Schuler endowment. What great satisfaction there is in knowing that we are helping a young person further their education and what better way than with a scholarship. Let's remember these young men and women are our future and we can help invest in their future by giving to the Schuler endowment and further their education. What an opportunity we have now to increase the Schuler endowment with the matching gift up to \$5,000. Technology Tools *(Continued from page 1)*

The WAO School Board underscored its commitment to the future in September when it added \$95,000 to the district's capital budget for technology, boosting it to \$150,000 for the current year. Acting on that emphasis, the district recently took delivery on a \$52,000 purchase of 37 Apple computers, 9 MacBooks (laptops) and 5 iPads. Funding for the purchase was from a combination of sources, including moneys from the district's existing 21st Century grant and the district's own capital reserve.

The 37 computers have already been installed in the elementary school, replacing outmoded technology in the school's larger computer lab. With previously acquired laptops, the 9 new MacBooks have made it possible to deploy a portable computer lab for use in the high school.

The iPads are being used for teacher familiarization with the technology and for classroom use in selected cases.

The iPad, a new personal device recently introduced by Apple, is a lower-cost alternative to a laptop, coming in at \$499, less than half the cost. While the iPad lacks computing moxie, it can be loaded up with curricular material — a digital biology book, say — and it is very easy to use. Kids can easily carry it around in their backpacks.

While iPads have features that may make them good candidates to be the "schoolbook" of the future, WAO is not rushing in that direction. As John Kinsey, one of the Apple education specialists visiting WAO in early November, advised, "We don't want this to be about a device. We want it to be about learning outcomes. Then decide what device will best help achieve the results you want. . . . Keep in mind, [technology] is just a tool. Great teachers are going to be great teachers no matter what tools they have to work with."

While the details are not crystal clear today, probably no one at WAO doubts that some sort of personal device giving students greater ownership of their learning strategies is a certainty for the future.

Generous contributions to the WAO Education Foundation already have made possible a good part of the district's venture into the exciting world of technology-based learning. Friends of the WAO school system can continue to help the local communities' youngsters become well prepared for the future through financial support of the Foundation's mission.

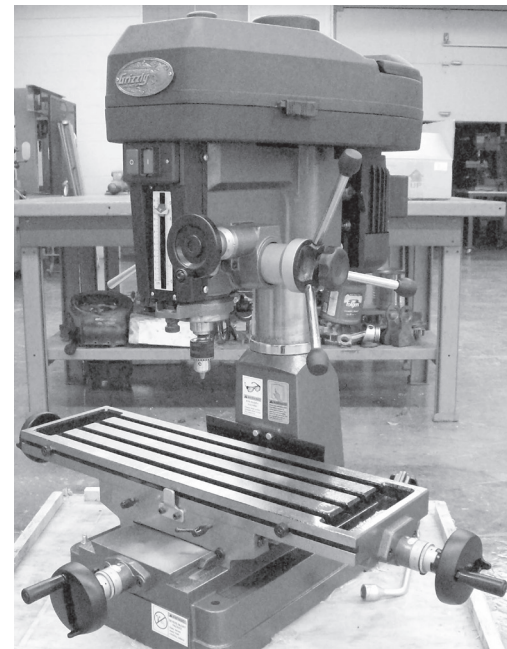
