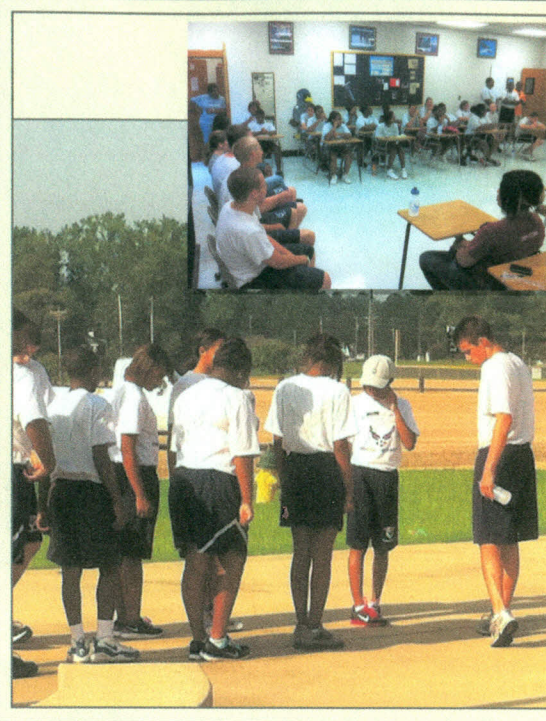


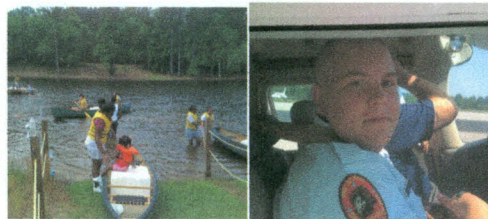
SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY

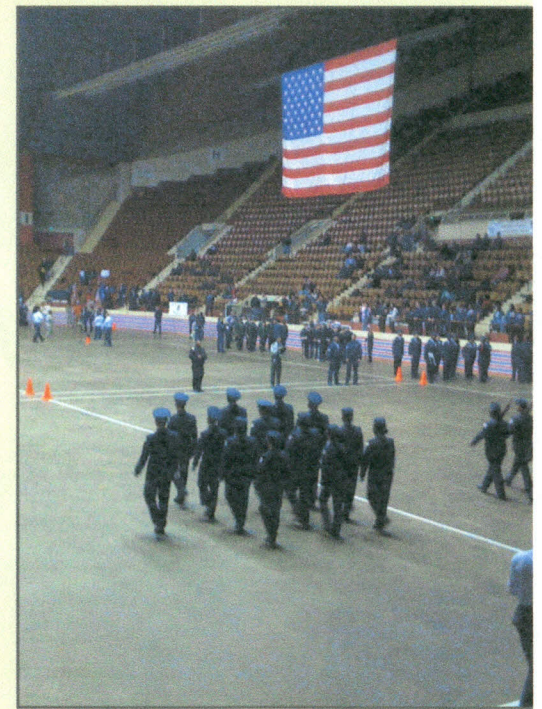
