Riverview Gardens School District is pleased to announce their continued participation in the Community Eligibility Program (CEP) for school year 2020-2021.

Riverview Gardens School District announced its revised free and reduced price policy for school children unable to pay the full price of meals served in schools under the National School Lunch Program and the School Breakfast Program in school year 2014-2015.

Participation in CEP allows Riverview Gardens School District to serve ALL meals (breakfast and lunch) to ALL students at no charge.

Meal applications will no longer be distributed and collected from families for a period of four (4) years as this is the time period Riverview Gardens School District has agreed to participate in CEP.

Community Eligibility Program is a portion of the Healthy, Hunger Free Kids Act of 2010 and became available in Missouri on July 1, 2014.

Non-Discrimination Statement
