













Current Attainment

Arizona is Facing a Teacher Shortage Crisis


- **2,221 teacher vacancies** were reported from **159** school districts in the fall of 2016
- To date 51 school districts report 1,941 teacher openings
- 24% of Arizona's teacher workforce is eligible to retire in the next 2 years
- Frizona's Median elementary teacher pay ranks 50th in the nation





School districts are governed by locally elected school boards that set budgets, district policies and establish school boundaries within their district. As an open enrollment state, families can send their child to any public school, district or charter.


