

3rd season at Williamson • 9th season as a high school head coach

Shumbe Hunter enters his 3rd season as the head boy's basketball coach at Williamson High School in 2020-21. The leader of Williamson program that won to the 2020 4A Boys State Championship and posted 20+ wins (50-14) in each of his two seasons at the school. He also was named Coach of the Year in four different categories for the 2020 season.

Hunter became head basketball coach at Williamson June of 2018.

In 9 seasons overall as a high school head coach, the 42-year-old Hunter has compiled a 103 – 100 record. Three of his 9 teams have advanced to state tournament play.

AT FOLEY

Hunter coached at Foley High School from 2010-2015, winning the Class 6A, Area 3 title in 2012. He was also Baldwin County Coach of the Year 2012. Hunter went 19-10 in his last season at the school (2014-2015).

GETTING STARTED

Prior to his time at Foley, Hunter worked as an assistant under notable coaches Joe Dix Jr. (East Hall High School) and Russ Triaga (Chestatee High School). Before his time at AAA powerhouse East Hall, which had won three Georgia State Titles from 2000 - 2010, he was an assistant at Chestatee (Ga.) for three years.

THE PERSONAL SIDE

Hunter was the first Daphne player to start varsity for four seasons. Hunter averaged 23ppg as a senior and a member of the Daphne High School Athletic Hall of Fame. He became the first Daphne basketball player to earn a scholarship to a four-year school when he signed with North Georgia in 1996. He earned a business degree and eventually went back to school to earn his degree in special education at The University of Georgia.

Hunter has been married for 15 years to his beautiful wife Sara Hunter. He has three lovely daughters Marley (15), Lyla (9) and Laura Josephine (3). Hunter also has one handsome son Malloy (6).
