# General Discussion – Topics of Concern:

- Another Goal should be to work on Customer Service focus more on the end user.
- What does BOCES look like in 1 5 years?
- Balance Developing new services without compromising current services.
- What is obsolete?
- What needs changed how soon?
- Is BOCES a Vendor or a Cooperative?
- Who do we want to be?
- Are there shared needs that are not being met?
- Board Members expressed an interest in obtaining a better understanding of the services each district is receiving.
- Request: Do a "Did You Know Session" at future Board Meetings. Suggestions from the floor included receiving information from department personnel (not always a report from the Program Director).
- Explain / give examples: How does the cooperative benefits the districts.
- <u>Suggestion</u>: BOCES information be included in district newsletters this information would educate teachers and parents alike. Also valuable for all new staff.
- <u>Suggestion</u>: Each Program Department establish a motto that harmonizes with the BOCES Motto
- <u>Suggestion</u>: Get input from teachers on what services are needed and how the current services are working.

• <u>Suggestion</u>: Every fall do a BOCES Orientation (BOCES 101) for anyone who wants to attend: i.e. anyone from a Board of Education, Parents, District Staff, etc. Open to public.

These documents were provided to each Board Member and were reviewed and discussed one at a time.

# Requests from Board of Directors:

- Each Program Director develop a criteria whereby they explain their services, which districts are taking advantage of their services, and outline how the services are impacting the end user (district, families, students, etc.).
- At each Board Meeting, provide a short program that will explain how each department operates.
  One department or service at a time; not all at once. Possibly have department staff (instead of the
  Director) present an overview of what they do in their specific job position. Example: Federal
  Programs reports on their homeless initiative and how the service is impacting the end user (the
  homeless).
