Motion:

1. ADOPTION OF THE TENTATIVE BUDGET 2013-2014

BE IT RESOLVED, that the tentative budget for the Greenwich Township Board of Education be approved for the 2013-2014 School Year using the 2013-2014 state aid figures and the Secretary to the Board of Education be authorized to submit the following tentative budget to the Executive County Superintendent of Schools for approval in accordance with the statutory deadline:

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4 5 And to advertise said tentative budget in the South Jersey Times in accordance with the form suggested by the State Department of Education and according to law; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a public hearing be held in the Nehaunsey Middle School Library, on March 25, 2013 at 7:00 p.m. for the purpose of conducting a public hearing on the budget for the 2013-2014 School Year.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Greenwich Township Board of Education requests the approval of a capital reserve deposit in the amount of \$75,000.00. The district intends to utilize these funds for future projects identified in its Long Range Facility Plan.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Greenwich Township Board of Education requests the approval to establish and make an initial deposit into a maintenance reserve account in the amount of \$25,000.00.

WHEREAS, the Greenwich Township Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to an within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers the efficient operation of the school district; and

WHEREAS, *N.J.A.C.* 6A:23B-1.1 et seq. requires Board members to received approval of these expenses by a majority of the full voting membership of the Board and staff members to receive prior approval of these expenses by the Superintendent of Schools and a majority of the full voting membership of the Board; and

WHEREAS, a Board of Education may establish, for regular district business travel only, an annual school year threshold of \$150.00 per staff member where prior Board approval shall not be required unless this annual threshold for a staff member is exceeded in a given school year (July 1 through June 30); and

WHEREAS, travel and related expenses not in compliance with *N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.1 et seq.*, but deemed by the Board of Education to be necessary and unavoidable as noted on the approved Board of Education Out of District Travel and Reimbursement Forms; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves all travel not in compliance with *N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.1 et seq.* as being necessary and unavoidable as noted on the approved Board of Education Out of District Travel and Reimbursement Forms, and

 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves travel and related expense reimbursement in accordance with *N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.2(b)*, to a maximum expenditure of \$1000.00 for all staff and board members.

Louis Fabiani wanted to know how this stands with our 2% cap that the state has set for us? Stephen Derkoski said one of the hardest things that the Board of Education has to do is create a budget because you are taking a look at the money that is necessary to run a school district many months in advance. We have to look at what is in the best interest for our students and our community and we created a budget that is in the best interest of both. We look at staffing, programs, facilities; we looked at every item that runs a school district. We did have a vote to move our election from April to November with the option to go to a 2% cap. This board has opted not go to a 2% cap but a 1.25% of the cap. There were many difficult decisions but it is a situation that still reflects the best interest of our students, staff and community.

2. 2012-2013 PROGRESS TARGETS ACTION PLAN

Motion: (Vernacchio/Chapkowski) to approve the following:

A. The approval to accept and adopt the 2012-2013 Progress Targets Action Plan for the Greenwich Township Public Schools.

Stephen Derkoski said this is a new item necessary to go forward with the County Superintendent. It was worked on and completed today and he will be handing copies out plus there are copies in the Superintendent's office. We have to identify areas in reference to where we are using Title I funds; we've identified Grade 3 and 4 at the Broad Street School to utilize the funds to assist staff development and enrich students in those grades to increase Language Arts test scores.

Motion carried by unanimous roll call vote.

3. PUBLIC – AGENDA/NON-AGENDA ITEMS

This is the time when anyone from the public who wishes to speak to the Board may do so. Please state your name, address and phone number. The Board will hear your concerns. The Board may or may not take action this evening. You will be notified either at this meeting by letter or telephone of any action the Board does take.

Lee Lucas, 361 Democrat Road, Gibbstown, NJ said to Scott Campbell that the tax rate will be increasing 1.25% to which **Mr. Campbell** agreed. **Mr. Lucas**

asked what the school tax will be? **Mr. Campbell** said there will be a rate decrease of \$.56. He told Mr. Lucas his school tax will be \$1.09 per \$100 of assessed value which is down from \$1.70. You really can't compare last year to this year because you now have new assessments. The bottom line is because of the new year and the re-evaluation, it all comes into play; it lowers the tax rate but it does not lower what you will pay in taxes.

Patty New, teacher at Broad Street School, asked if Source4Teachers is budgeted and is the Board considering renewing their contract for the new school year? **Stephen Derkoski** responded that it is budgeted but nothing has come to his attention as far as renewing their contract even though he has heard that there were some concerns with them. **Susan Vernacchio** asked when will their contract be up? **Scott Campbell** answered, "June". **Mrs. Vernacchio** said we should be looking at all of our contracts on an annual basis.

Terry DiSanto, Child Study Team, said she did question the Source4Teachers contract at the January meeting. The Superintendent's office would have to reestablish their calling base of teachers. There is a process that involves fingerprinting which takes time. **Mrs. DiSanto** then asked if there is any reduction in school staff based on this budget? **Mr. Derkoski** said there is no reduction.

Patty New said last year some programs were reduced because of the decrease in ratables. Since there is an increase now, will those programs be reinstated or will any new programs be brought in? **Scott Campbell** said everything is "status quo". No programs were eliminated but no programs were added. **Mr. Derkoski** said if anyone is familiar with P.A.R.C.C. it is a mandated item to start in 2015 and what is necessary is for us to increase our technology so that we are prepared. That is a "big ticket item" in the budget. **Roseanne Lombardo** said that P.A.R.C.C. (Partnership for the Assessment and Readiness for College and Careers) is going to be a big state test to get students ready for "college and careers".

Terry DiSanto said there were areas that were identified where to use the Title I funds and Grades 3 and 4 were targeted in an effort to improve the Language Arts scores. Does the Board have any idea how this is going to be done? **Mr. Derkoski** said that he can give Mrs. DiSanto the action plan which is about 15 items that were established. The third and fourth grades were mandatory mainly because their test scores were below what we thought were necessary. The action plan involves teachers, Title I staff and administration.

Lee Lucas said at the \$1.09 tax rate, Gibbstown may be back to #1 as having the lowest tax rate. **Mr. Campbell** believes that Elk Township is the lowest right now. Mr. Lucas finished by saying that Gibbstown is in the top three.
