REGISTRATION / SCHEDULE PICK-UP

**PICTURE DAY
SEPTEMBER 10**

Picture Day is Friday, September 10th. Picture packets will be sent home with students the week prior. All students are required to have their photo taken for student IDs and to be included in the yearbook. Students must wear standardized shirts, but may bring a shirt to change in to or wear underneath their standardized shirt. If the student is not in attendance this day, picture retakes will be done on October 29th.

FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL / SCHOOL HOURS

The first day of school is Monday, August 2nd at 8am. The first bell will ring at 7:55am for students to go to their lockers and classrooms. First period classes begin at 8:00am.

SCHOOL HOURS: 8am - 2:35pm

EARLY RELEASE HOURS: 8am - 1pm

OFFICE HOURS: 7:30am - 3:30pm

Students/parents are not allowed in the building before 7:30am; there is no supervision.

EARLY RELEASE THURSDAYS

Beginning August 5th through the end of May, students will be dismissed at 1pm EVERY Thursday. Students will attend their regular classes and have lunch, although the class periods will be shorter.

SYNERGY PARENT VUE

Keep track of your students grades by logging into your Synergy ParentVue account. You will need an activation key in order to log in for the first time. If you have not already created an account, instructions and an activation key will be provided on request.

COMPUTER ACCESS - If you do not have computer access at home, we have a limited number of computers available in our office lobby for use by parents for school purposes only.

E-MAIL UPDATES

Don't forget to update any changes to your email address so that you will continue to receive the newsletter link and other important information pertaining to Thunderbolt. Contact our office at 854-7224 with any changes.

PARENT VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Please sign up in the office if you'd like to be a parent volunteer. Some areas we need help with are: Helping during Registration, folding shirts, doing laundry, cut out affirmations, student of the month pictures/posters, cleaning up lost and found, make copies, working the snack bar, help with Booster Club fundraisers, etc.

LUNCH APPLICATIONS

The school year 2021-22 Free and Reduced Meals application must be renewed each year. Parents please renew your applications on line at Family.Titank12.com. Our office computers and hard copies will be available during registration if you are unable to complete this process at home.

All students that were approved for school year 2020-21 in the LHUSD will have their benefits carryover until September, 2021. We encourage you to get your new application resubmitted as early as possible to avoid any lapse in benefit.

**It is important to note that a new application must be filled out each year.*

*ALL students will be eligible for free breakfast and lunch for a limited time. Milk, bottled water, or ala carte items will be available to purchase.

We ask that you still complete the application for free/reduced lunch to determine Title funding, P-EBT, etc.

LUNCH ACCOUNTS

If your student has a pre-paid meal account you can easily check the balance by either downloading the **Titan Family Connect** phone application or checking online with a Family.Titank12.com account. A free account can be set up to receive low balance alerts and the ability to see what your student is purchasing. Meal accounts can also be funded through Family.Titank12.com. There is a \$2.60 service fee per transaction.

- Taher will accept personal checks made out to LHUSD
- Taher has a "NO CHANGE" policy for meals. Any money given to a cashier for any purchase that has change coming, will be put on the student's account. No change will be given back.
- If students do not have a lunch or money on their account, they will be given an alternate meal on request consisting of peanut butter, crackers, carrot sticks, ranch dressing, a fruit and milk.

SCHOOL FEES

- Band class in which students must rent instruments have an additional fee attached (\$5-\$40/semester).
- Students in P.E. will be required to purchase the mandatory P.E. shorts for \$7-\$9 depending on the size.

NO CHECK POLICY

We will gladly accept cash, debit/credit cards, or money orders (NO Checks) for purchases made in the Thunderbolt office.

Please DO NOT send \$50 or \$100 bills with your child to school for lunch or other school purchases.

Parents/guardians can call to report an absence at anytime and leave a voicemail message - on the attendance phone number. If you do not call in your student's absence, you will receive an automated message from us.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

EXCESSIVE ABSENCES OR TARDIES

We are proud of our attendance at Thunderbolt and look forward to continuing our low student absence rate. It is critical for students to be in school to learn and just as important that they are in class when the bell rings. Every minute counts for the highest level of learning! We will recognize those classes periodically who have the lowest number of absences and/or tardies.

If a student is tardy more than four (4) times per quarter he/she will earn a consequence.

This includes *both excused and unexcused* tardies. Absences are considered excessive if they exceed eight (8) per semester. We will contact you directly should your child exceed the number of absences allowed by law. This includes both excused and unexcused absences. If you have a note from a doctor please send it with your child.

Please note that attendance and tardies may affect some club eligibility criteria such as NJHS and Renaissance.

STUDENT HANDBOOK

The student handbook, located on our website, provides valuable information about our school and will be reviewed with students during the first few days of school. Please review this handbook with your child early in the school year. Hard copies are available upon request.

TITLE I/PARENTS' RIGHT TO KNOW

We are a Title I School. Title I provides financial assistance to local educational agencies to meet the needs of special educationally disadvantaged children. The purpose of Title I is to help all children achieve the state's academic standards. This is accomplished through supplemental programs that consist of instructional services, instructional support services, school wide reform efforts, and increased involvement of parents in their children's education.

We are pleased to notify you that in accordance with the Elementary and Secondary Act (ESEA), as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), you have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's teacher. Specifically, you may request the following:

- Whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or substitute status.
- The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

NO BACKPACKS IN THE CLASSROOM

For the safety of our students, please keep in mind that backpacks are not allowed in the classrooms. They must be kept in the student lockers at all times during the school day. The backpacks with wheels do not fit in the lockers, so please avoid purchasing that style.

WATER BOTTLES / DRINKING CONTAINERS

If your student chooses to bring a drink to school, please follow these guidelines:

- Re-useable water bottles/containers must contain **WATER ONLY** and in a **clear bottle**. No hydro flasks, etc. will be allowed.
- No energy drinks, coffee, Vitamin water, Gatorade, sodas or any other liquids that contain alcohol or high levels of caffeine will be allowed in the building.
- All drinks must conform to the District Wellness Policy and Arizona Nutrition Standards. (J-4950)
- Drink refreshments brought into the building by students may be used for breakfast or lunch purposes. **They are not to be taken into classrooms.**
- Food and drinks purchased in the cafeteria must be consumed and disposed of prior to leaving the cafeteria.

The principal will have the right to make exceptions to this policy when deemed necessary.

DRESS CODE

- All students are required to wear the District Board approved Thunderbolt standardized shirts at all times during the regular school day.
- Students are required to wear the District Board approved LHUSD standardized outerwear at all times during the regular school day. No other jackets can be worn inside the building.
- Standardized shirts and/or standardized jackets cannot be altered, tied, or cut.
- **Bottoms must be fingertip length, or longer, and cover all undergarments. From waist to fingertip, clothing must be opaque with no holes, rips, tears, or frays.** Please keep this in mind when shopping for school clothes.

When a student's attire violates the dress code, the office will supply the student with school appropriate clothing items to wear during that school day.

DISTRICT WELLNESS POLICY

Due to Arizona Nutrition Standards and our District Wellness Policy, parents are discouraged from bringing treats for the entire classroom or for children other than their own *at any time* due to food allergies. This includes lunch for your child's friends.

Please do not bring or drop off these items to be shared:

- fast food deliveries/pizza
- cupcakes/cookies
- homemade treats/food items

If you do bring in food, only bring it for YOUR child, not your child's friends.

BUS INFORMATION

The LHUSD school board policy for transportation of students establishes the distance of one (1) mile from home to school for middle school students eligible for bus service.

- Registering for bus service needs to be done each year.
- If you move or your student is off the bus for more than 5 days you will need to re-register in the school office.
- Students cannot be transported to another bus stop other than the one assigned to them.
- Sharing a ride with a friend is not permitted.

Students/Parents will be able to find out their bus stop locations and times during registration days.

CELL PHONE PROCEDURES

Students may: 1) leave cell phone in their locked locker, 2) check cell phone into their teacher or 3) leave cell phone at home. Guidelines for Students:

- A. The student takes full responsibility for their device.
- B. The student complies with the teachers' instruction pertaining to the project using their digital device and uses the device only during those specific classroom hours.
- C. The personal device shall be charged prior to bringing it to school.
- D. The student adheres to the rules stated in the IT Use Agreement policy.

Students in possession of their phone/device during class will earn a discipline referral which will result in a consequence and may require the parent to pick up the device.

SPORTS PHYSICALS

If your student will be participating in sports this year, it is mandatory they have a physical on file. Physicals are good 1 year from the date of the exam.

The following must be recorded in the Athletic Director's office PRIOR to a student participating in try-outs or practice:

1. Athletic Contract
2. Athlete Emergency Card
3. Proof of Medical Insurance
4. Medical Release Form
5. Concussion Statement & Acknowledgement
6. Sports Physical (good for 1 year)

Havasu Stick'em will be giving out vouchers for *free* sports physicals to the 1st 100 students on Saturday, July 31st from 8am-Noon at the Aquatic Center.

TrueCare, Nextcare and HRMC Urgent Cares charge \$25 per athlete for sports physicals. Appointments may be necessary. If you have any questions you may contact them at 846-4343 (TrueCare), 453-4600 (Nextcare) or 505-1030 (HRMC).

TAX CREDIT

Taxpayers filing in Arizona have the unique opportunity to redirect a portion of state tax dollars they already pay, to public education. The credit allows an Arizona taxpayer to contribute \$200 per individual tax return or \$400 per joint tax return to a school's extra curricular program.

Who can make a contribution?

We can accept contributions only from individuals; not businesses or corporations.

Do I have to have children enrolled in school?

No. Any Arizona individual paying state income tax can make a tax credit contribution to be used towards extra curricular fees.

Do I have to live within the District?

No. Any individual who pays Arizona State income tax can contribute.

Do I have to donate the full \$200 or \$400?

No, but remember, you can take this credit on any tax liability for state income taxes up to \$200 on an individual tax return or \$400 on a joint return. You may donate up to your \$200 or \$400 limit in installments during the calendar year or donate it at one time.

How does this work on my tax return?

As an example, let's say you made a \$300 tax credit contribution. When you file your state taxes, you will note the credit with a 322 form (downloadable from the State). If your State tax return calculates to a \$500 refund, applying the credit will increase your refund to \$800. If your State tax return calculates to a \$400 liability (you owe) then applying the credit will reduce your liability to \$100. However, you cannot receive a refund greater than your State income tax assessment for the tax year.

Tax Credit contributions are to the school/activity of your choice or can be made for individual students!

CHILD NUTRITION DEPARTMENT NEWS

Welcome back to the 2021-2022 school year at the Lake Havasu Unified School District!

USDA has announced that ALL students may eat 1- complete breakfast and/or 1- complete lunch for FREE this school year! Purchases of single cartons of milk, bottled water, single entrée items, and ala carte offerings will require payment of cash (change will go on meal account) or student meal account. Please monitor your student's meal account balance through the Titan app or at Family.TitanK12.com.

DID YOU KNOW

You don't need to complete a Free/Reduced Meal Application to receive FREE meals, but the application may benefit you and your student's school in other ways.

- P-EBT - Eligibility to receive or continue to receive Pandemic EBT
- School Funding - Maintains funding for your school programs and services.
- Academic Tests - Reduced registration fees or AP, SAT, and/or ACT tests.
- Athletics - Discounted fees to participate in District or non-District programs (when available)
- College Application Fees - Discounted rates on fees associated with applying for college.
- Internet Access - Eligible for discounted rates on internet/broadband services.

Meal Applications can be found online at Family.TitanK12.com, our District website or at your child's school.

Menus are available on the District/school websites, the LHUSD app and the Taher Food 4 Life app. Menu items are subject to last minute changes without notice due to supply chain issues.

We look forward to feeding your student a nutritionally complete breakfast and lunch that's low in sodium, added sugar and topped off with as much locally grown produce (when available) that we can find!

PARKING LOT PROCEDURES

Parents,

We have worked hard over the last few years to create a parking lot procedure that keeps the traffic flow moving and keeps students safe. Although it's a bit challenging to get such a large number of parents in and out in a short amount of time our system works well with everyone's cooperation.

Please follow these procedures:

MORNING & AFTERNOON DROP OFF & PICK UP PROCEDURE

See map on the following page with instructions

ALL STUDENTS MEETING PARKED CARS MUST CROSS WITH THE CROSSING GUARD FOR SAFETY.

Please do NOT form a second lane of traffic in between the cars at the fence and the parking lot.

- This is unsafe for picking up your child and others.
- Cars are not watching for students to cut in between cars.
- A second lane also blocks the traffic waiting to come into and out of the drop off lane.

When leaving a parking space cars must loop around to join the traffic flow running parallel to the fence. We will be in the lot to guide you in the process.

There are slight differences between the morning and afternoon procedures. This is because cars in the afternoon may need to circle the parking lot to locate a parking spot. They must have the ability to do so. This is not the case in the morning as all cars are moving quickly through the lot after dropping off students.

We would ask that you remain 100% focused on the traffic and students while in the lot by not talking on your cell phone during pick up and drop off. Student safety is our goal.

Our goal is to keep every child safe during pickup and drop off times. Your cooperation is appreciated. Thank you!



Mornings – Drop off from 7:25 to 7:50, class begins at 8

Pick-Up Lane: Pull into the pick-up lane and have **students exit car quickly**. Please do not have students wait in the car as traffic backs up onto Thunderbolt.

If the drop-off lane is full, turn to the left and pull forward to the teacher at the cross walk.

Do NOT form a second lane next to the drop-off lane or cars will not be able to exit.



Please do not pull into the bus lane, circle, or the staff parking lot. ONLY IF your student has an injury (broken foot/leg) then you may pull into the staff parking.

To sign-up for bussing, please call 928-505-6960 to see if you live in a qualifying area.

Afternoons – Students will release at 2:35

Pick-Up Lane: Pull forward and pick-up students in the front half of the line.

Parking Lot: If the pick-up lane is full, please pull into a parking space. Your student will be walked across traffic with the Crossing Guard. Students may not cross traffic anywhere other than with the cross walk. If you park in the spaces closest to Thunderbolt Ave you will drive back alongside the curbside pick-up lane to exit the parking lot.



Please do not pull into the bus lane, circle, or the staff parking lot. ONLY IF your student has an injury (broken foot/leg) then you may pull into the staff parking.

2021-22 Schedule Q1

SOME students will NOT rotate straight to lunch. Those students will rotate to the class they have AFTER lunch and then be dismissed from that class on a staggered schedule.

***Some B Hall students** will go to lunch with their 4th period classes

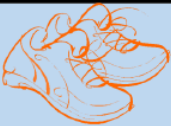
