Powerful Irish To Meet Strong Perry High Team

The Perry High School Panthers show they are not afraid of anybody—they're going to open the season against the highest rated team in Class AA, Dublin, here Friday night. Kickoff time is 8 o'clock.

The Dublin Irish got the No. 1 rating last week in an Atlanta Journal estimate of the Class AA situation.

In the same rating, Perry is said to be the No. 3 team in Class A, even standing above the usually strong teams of Americus and Fitzgerald.

Dublin returned 18 men from last year's 2-AA championship team led by Chan Beasley, a 6-0 195-pound halfback who seems destined for stardom.

A Perry Boy Again

Another one of the Perry boys, Bill, member of a Dublin family that has furnished two outstanding athletes, is quarterback of the Irish.

Perry's Coach Herb St. John said the other teams in 2-A Region "put the finger on us to set us up so they can knock us down."

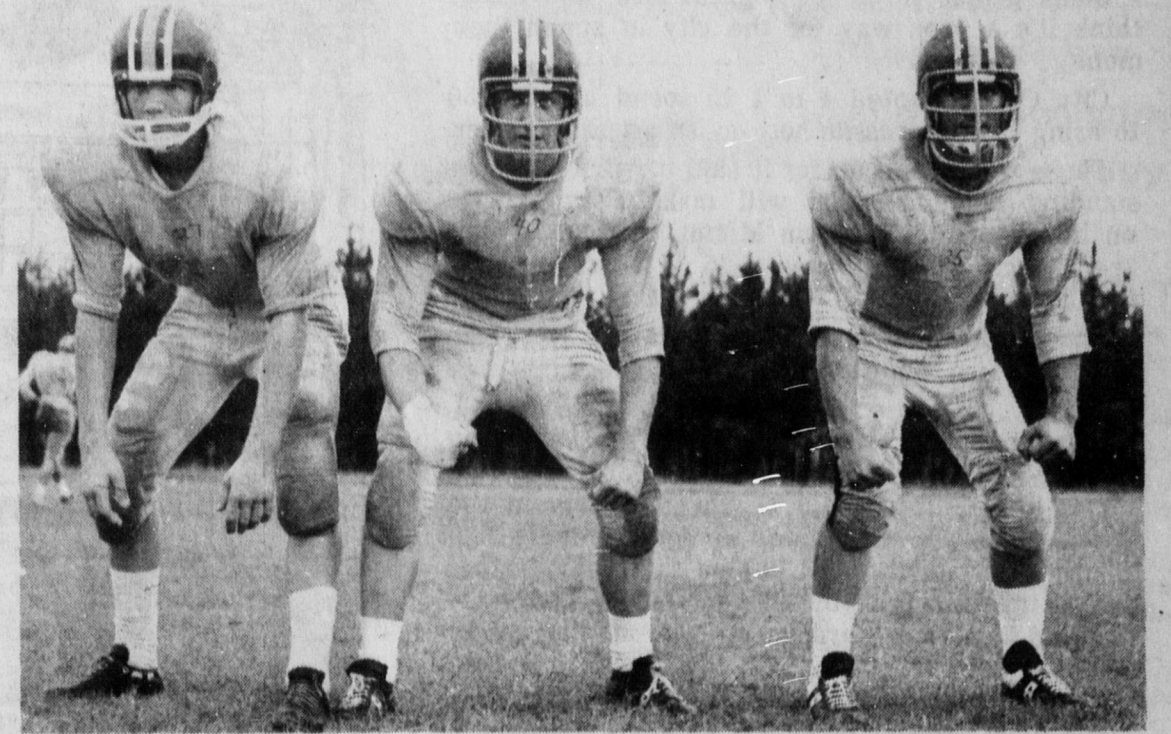
Perry got a pretty good reputation toward the last of the 1966 season because they started knocking off some teams that were supposed to be much better than Perry.

BOOSTER CLUB MEETS TONIGHT

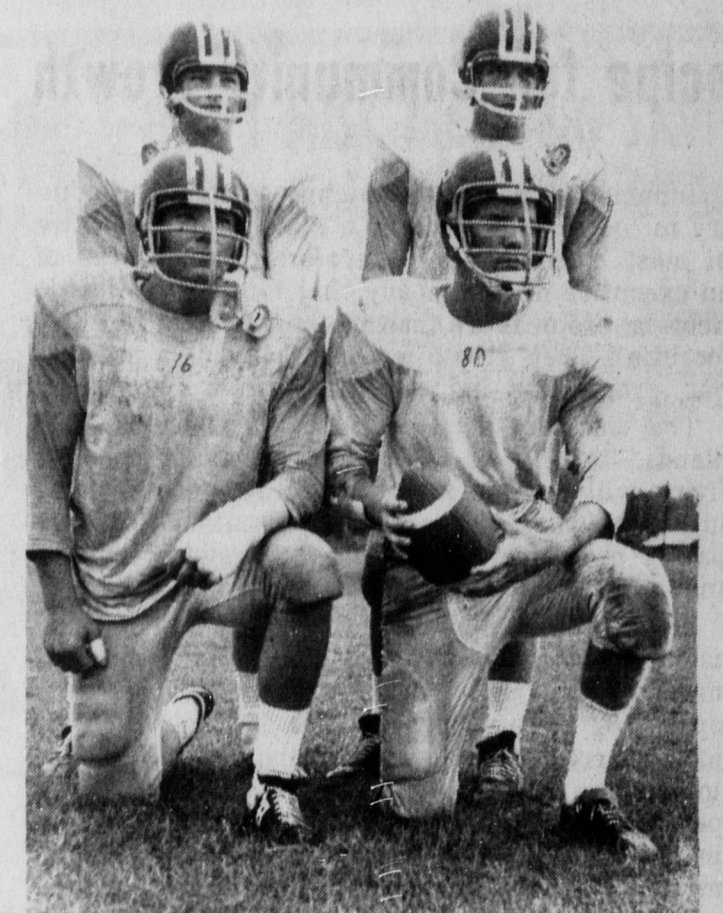
