Re: Use of School Facilities by the New Milford Youth Baseball and Softball League

Dear Dr. Paddyfote:

This letter is in response to your request for an opinion concerning an offer made by the New Milford Youth Baseball and Softball League to donate approximately \$30,000 to make improvements to two fields at Sarah Noble Intermediate School. In exchange for their donation, the League is looking for preferential use of the fields. Additionally, the League has expressed a willingness to take over the maintenance responsibilities for the two fields in question.

Connecticut General Statutes §10-239 authorizes any local board of education to provide for the use of "school grounds or other school facility within its jurisdiction for non-profit educational or community purposes." Pursuant to this statutory authorization, the School District has adopted Policy 1330(a)-(e) which puts the use of school facilities under the control and supervision of the Facilities Manager who "shall be responsible to assure the use of school facilities shall be limited to those activities that do not infringe upon or in any way interfere with the operation of the schools and the best interests of the Board of Education." I do not know what other community groups also have expressed an interest in using the two fields at Sarah Noble Intermediate School. Your policy permits an organization to request use of a particular facility for a period of time "not to exceed six (6) months." It also sets forth a procedure to be followed in the event "more than one organization requests the use of a particular facility at the same time." See 1330(b), paragraph 2. Among the criteria to be considered by the Superintendent of Schools are: the organization that will make the best use of the facility in terms of the number of people to be served, and/or the lack of an equivalent program in the community, the organizations currently using the facilities and the organization wishing to expand existing activities. Those criteria are to be considered by the Superintendent of Schools only if a mutually satisfactory compromise among the organizations involved, cannot be achieved. It would appear, therefore, that

according to the Board's policy, the New Milford Youth Baseball and Softball League may already be eligible to receive preferential authorization to use the two fields, regardless of whether they make a donation.

The Board of Education has a policy number 3280 that allows it to accept gifts valued at more than \$1,000. Should the donor restrict the use of the gift, or donation, the Board shall either honor the restriction or return the property to the donor, pursuant that policy (3280(a)). Is it the intention of the New Milford Youth Baseball and Softball League to restrict the use of the \$30,000 donation in any way other than that it be used to improve the two fields at Sarah Noble Intermediate School? If there are other restrictions intended, the Board will have to decide whether they are acceptable.

Pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes §10-220 the New Milford Board of Education, at all times, maintains control over its school property. The Board of Education can retain outside vendors or subcontractors to make the necessary improvements to the two fields but it cannot turn over ultimate control of the maintenance responsibility to an outside entity, public or private. While any outside group may recommend a vendor, subcontractor or volunteers, all decisions on behalf of the Board are made by the Facilities Manager or other designee, and all contracts are between the school district and such parties. It should also be pointed out that some of the "maintenance" of the two fields may involve bargaining unit work within the domain of one of the Board's collective bargaining units. To the extent services traditionally have been provided by the Board's custodial staff, for example, lining a field or mowing the grass, it may need to be done by Board of Education employees. Finally, should the Board through its policy or regulations charge fees, the Board could amend its policy or regulation to give it express authority to waive the fees when it is in the best interests of the district to do so.

I am writing in response to your letter of August 31, 2015 regarding the New Milford Public Schools voluntary corrective action plan (VCP) for New Milford High School dated July 9, 2015.

The District takes seriously its responsibilities to provide a school building that is in compliance with all appropriate regulations. We have been reviewing your August 31, 2015 letter regarding the VCP report and we are committed to addressing those items we can in a timely fashion. In that regard, we have updated our VCP and it is included here.

The Town of New Milford has recently approved the installation of two turf fields at New Milford High School. The plan will include providing handicapped accessibility to all fields. The work will begin this fall and we anticipate completion by August 2016.

There are a number of items on the list that will require review and a timeframe for corrective action cannot be identified at this time. Our Facilities Manager has recently resigned and we are working with our current staff and an architect to determine what needs to be done to comply with your directives. Specifically we are addressing:

- Access to the seating area in the auditorium
- Locker/Shower room access
- Bleachers at the athletic fields
- Stairs and Stairwells

Following the consultation with our architects, we will be able to provide you with steps to address these noted areas. We anticipate submitting this updated report by the end of December 2015.
