





The Houston County School District will accept applications for the 2021-2022 Pre-Kindergarten program **March 1 - 26, 2021.**

Pre-K students must be four years of age on or before September 1, 2021. Children who will be 5 years old on September 1, 2021, and are not currently enrolled in one of the school district's Pre-K classrooms, should register as a kindergarten student for the 2021-2022 school year.


We will be selling doughnuts March 19<sup>th</sup> in the car rider line. Keep an eye on your child's Wednesday Folders for an order form to preorder as well.

#### Spirit Packs





### Spotlight on Safety



Parents, remember that if your child or anyone in your household takes a COVID-19 test please contact the school, as a quarantine may be required. Please Email or call our school nurse ([Theresa.wahiwe@hcbe.net](mailto:Theresa.wahiwe@hcbe.net)) if you have any COVID-19 related issues in your home. This includes if anyone in your house currently has COVID-19 symptoms or has recently taken a COVID-19 test, even if negative. Also, email her if your KCES student has been exposed to a positive person in the last 10 days. Please do not send your child to school if any of these are the case. As always, make sure your child has been symptom and fever free for 24 hours prior to sending them to school. Please continue the AWESOME job you have been doing sending your children to school with their masks and water bottles!

### Drop off and pick up procedures:



We need everyone's help to make sure our morning drop off and afternoon pick up goes smoothly. Our priority is to begin and end school safely, move parents through the line quickly, and get the most out of our instructional

day! Doing your part with the following items will help us have great days at KCES. Thank you!!!

- Arrive as early as possible to drop off your child. We will begin unloading at 7:45. The earlier you arrive, the better traffic will be. We begin morning announcements at 8:25, so if your child is planning to eat breakfast, they should arrive no later than 8:15.
- If you are not in the drop off spot by 8:30, you will have to park and check your child(ren) into school tardy.
- Have your child(ren) ready to unload when you arrive. Please have them ready to go with book bags, lunch boxes, and masks so they can exit the car as soon as you come to a stop.
- Plan to have your children unload from the right side of your car. This is the safest and quickest way to unload.
- For afternoon pick up, make sure you have your yellow, three-digit card ready to show in the pick-up line. This card is your "ticket" that shows you are approved to pick up that child. Without this, you will have to park, come inside, and provide identification.
- Write your child's name in BIG letters on the back of your yellow card and have it displayed for the name caller as you pull forward in the line.
- If you are picking your child up early, it must be before 3:15. After 3:15 you will have to pick your child up in the car rider line.
