












Gifted Education in NMPS

Role of TAG teacher


- Identify students with high potential. Then, develop or modify enrichments and curriculum extensions in response to their needs.

- 4. Facilitate frequent and ongoing communication with TAG students and stakeholders.


Additional considerations



 Update NMPS TAG plan based on recent Connecticut legislation regarding talented and gifted (<u>Public Act No. 17-82</u>)

Public Act No. 17-82

- Took effect on July 1, 2017
- Should ensure that all high-ability students in our state receive appropriate services, no matter what their school's zip code
- Requires the Commissioner of Education to designate an expert staff member to be responsible for providing assistance to educators and parents regarding identification and provision of services to Connecticut's gifted and talented students
- Requires the Department of Education to develop "best practices" guidelines for academic and social-emotional services to gifted and talented students, as well as professional development for teachers
