2. 1212 School Volunteers

- Mrs. McInerney noted that fingerprinting is expensive and not required for school volunteers. Ms. Baldelli said that is correct but that Board Counsel has recommended that it be done for due diligence and the Board agreed.
- Mrs. Faulenbach said when fingerprinting was discussed several years ago the Board took a strong stance that it be done.
- Mr. Schemm noted that some organizations, such as athletic groups, use background checks instead of fingerprinting. Ms. Baldelli said fingerprinting is a higher level and is reviewed through the state police and FBI.
- Ms. Baldelli said she clarified with Board Counsel that as long as the volunteer is continuous from year to year they only need to complete the attached form once.
- Mrs. McInerney asked if the information is manually recorded. Ms. Baldelli said that is correct; they use classroom and PTO lists.
- Dr. Tracy noted that the district does more than required.
- Ms. Baldelli said this year so far there are 1137 volunteers throughout the five schools, not counting PTO which is another 493. There are also 2 volunteers at the LHTC. She said she is proud of the district's inviting nature and the response of the volunteers. She noted that fingerprinting is done in Human Resources in New Milford, unlike some other districts where volunteers have to go to the Police department or some other offsite setting.
- The committee did not recommend any changes. The review date will be noted on the policy.

- Mrs. Faulenbach wondered how many contests are offered each year.
- Mrs. McInerney said she would also like to know that number. She said the contests are great for students but she wants to make sure that due diligence is done by the organization.
- Mr. Schemm said the policy references a CAS list of approved contests and he would like to see that list. He noted that the policy does not have a statutory reference tie either.
- Mrs. Faulenbach said the policy states that the contest should provide value to the education core and asked how the district ensures that fulfillment.
