Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment

- The principals and guidance counselors from Colebrook, Canaan, and Pittsburg continue to meet to draft a schedule for the 2020-2021 school year utilizing teachers in Colebrook, Canaan, and Pittsburg.
- Don Noyes Chevrolet donated a car for students to work on in Mr. March's automotive.
- The CARE (Children Are Reason Enough) team discussed ways to get students more involved in literacy around school, for example, reading announcements and creating a monthly school-wide newsletter. Also, It was decided that for the remainder of this school year, the CARE team will focus on improving literacy at CAES through school wide mentors. This project will begin the week of March 2 and it will be called Read Across Colebrook. We will tie this in with Colebrook's 250th Anniversary.
- Mr. March's woodworking students are helping me with a project. They are making two book shelves and painting them green. These bookshelves will be placed in two businesses in town and will house free adult and children's books that will be free to take or swap to promote literacy in town.
- There will be collaboration between Stewartstown Community School and CAES. SCS Elementary teacher Becky Hodge reach out to ask if grades 1-3, 16 students, she would like to visit a hands-on science museum for our end-of- year field trip, but without a long drive. Since Kim Dorman does a lot of hands-on science with her high school classes, together they developed this concept of Kim's students creating a science event at CAES one afternoon (May 22). It would be part science fair, part demonstration of scientific principle with many different activities, and will allow SCS younger students to interact with CAES older students as they explain and demonstrate their projects.
- Band and Chorus Program At different points during semester one, 8 students dropped HS band or chorus. The original class size was 11. This leaves 3 students remaining from Colebrook and 1 from Canaan for a total of 4 students.
- Foreign Language Program no students signed up for French 3.
- Writing grant for CBE work and social/emotional strategies for teachers to use with students.
- Credit recovery programming for course competencies due to failures.

HIGH SCHOOL

- 15 students failed one or more courses
- Of the 15, 1 was a post grad, 1 was a senior, 1 was a junior, 4 were sophomores, and 8 were freshmen
- Of the 15, 8 failed more than one course: 4 failed more than 2
- 1 student failed more than 3 courses
- 6 students are on learning plans, and another was just placed on 1
- 2 of the freshmen who failed a course are already off grade level from failures during the 18-19 year
- Math was the subject area with the most failures (9) followed by Science and Social Studies (4), English & Health (3), PE (2) and ICT, Foreign Language and Music (1)
- I can break this down more, but many students were quite close in the 60% range to passing. Some
 of the failing grades included 66 (2), 68 (2), 64 (3), 67 (3), 61, 62 and 69

- 33 students failed one or more courses
- Of the 33, 19 were in grades 5-8 and 14 in elementary
- Of the 33, 7 students failed more than one course
- 4 students failed 2 courses
- 2 students failed 4 courses

- ELA was the subject area with the most failures for middle school (10) followed by math (6), science (5), health (4), social studies (3) PE (1), writing (1) band (1) computer apps (1)
