WHAT IS FFA?

FFA is a national youth organization that strives to make a positive difference in the lives of students. Agricultural Education develops a student's potential for premier leadership, personal growth, and career success.

The Bonaire Middle School FFA is one of the largest student organizations on campus, with 80 to 100 members participating each year. There are over 34,000 FFA members in the state of Georgia and over 557,000 members in the United States. Why do so many students join the FFA? They join the FFA because they meet new people, participate in competitions, travel, develop leadership skills, and have lots of fun!



Who can join FFA?

Membership in the FFA is open to every student that attends Bonaire Middle School. All students that join FFA will have one semester in Agricultural Education class.

How do I join FFA?

To join the FFA simply submit a FFA membership application and \$15.00 membership dues to Mrs. Keily in room 208. Membership must be renewed each year if you want to continue in the organization. This year we will have an online registration process (please see the next page)

What if I can't attend every meeting?

Attendance is <u>not</u> mandatory for every meeting, unless you are a FFA officer. Of course, the more you participate the more you will benefit from your FFA experience.

What can I do in the FFA besides the monthly meetings?

There are many opportunities available to student members of the FFA. You can travel to leadership conferences and conventions, become a member of a competition team, participate in community service projects, be a part of garden club, and even attend summer camp.

How do I know when activities are happening?

What competition teams does our FFA chapter have?

FFA competitions are called Career Development Events (CDE). The Bonaire Middle School FFA has the following CDE teams:

- ◆ FFA Quiz (quiz bowl style competition over FFA facts and history)
- ◆ Floriculture (growing and identifying plants)
- ♦ Meats Evaluation (learn to evaluate carcasses for quality and yield grade, and identify wholesale and/or retail cuts)
- ♦ Nursery/Landscape (growing and identifying trees and shrubs)
- ◆ Poultry (grading and identifying live birds, carcasses, eggs, and poultry products)
- ♦ Public Speaking (preparing and presenting your own speech or memorizing and presenting the FFA Creed)
- ◆ Veterinary Science (equipment and breed identification, as well as handling and restraint)
- ◆ Rabbit Show Team (raising and showing a purebred rabbit)
