The 6th graders are learning about Social Issues.


Middle School Math

6th Grade Social Studies

<u>Unit 5: Latin America: Past Shapes the Present</u> Purpose: The purpose of this unit is to expose students to the various forms of government and economic systems in Mexico, Cuba, and Brazil. Students will also focus on the different types of trade barriers such as tariffs and embargoes.
