This week every grade will be learning about Origami! Origami art came from Japan and has been around for hundreds of years. Origami is the art of folding one sheet of paper with no cuts into a form. The form can be anything like a boat, cat, dragon or even a bird. In fact, there is an old japanese legend that if you fold one thousand origami cranes you can make one wish that will actually come true. All you need is paper!
