Dear Parent and Guardians,

This letter is a follow-up to the alert that was sent out last evening. We were notified yesterday that a second individual in our district has tested positive for COVID-19. Immediately following notification, we contacted the Pennsylvania Department of Health and have concluded that only intermittent contact occurred with the infected individual. Being that this is the second person who tested positive within our middle school within a fourteen-day period, we are following the Department of Health, as well as the Department of Education's guidance and moving to a remote instructional delivery model starting November 17, 2020. Students in grades 6-8 will follow their virtual learning schedules until returning to their regular face-to-face schedules on December 1, 2020. If you need any further information regarding your child's virtual learning schedule, please visit our website or contact your child's teacher directly.

In addition, all middle school athletics have been postponed until students return on December 1, 2020. We are working on rescheduling the games affected as a result of this decision.

COVID-19 is a disease that is capable of rapidly spreading person-to-person. People infected are capable of exposing others to COVID-19 even if their symptoms are mild, such as a cough, or even if they are asymptomatic. Additionally, exposure is possible by touching a surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching one's mouth, nose, or eyes. Symptoms of COVID-19 may include fever, cough, shortness of breath, chills, repeated shaking, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, fatigue, congestion or runny nose, diarrhea, nausea/vomiting, and loss of taste or smell. Older adults and people who have serious chronic medical conditions are at a higher risk for serious illness.

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19 as stated above, it is extremely important that you do not send your child to school and contact your local health care provider.

The Frazier School District is concerned about the health and well-being of you, your family and the general public during this outbreak. We understand that this is a difficult time, and that some individuals may need additional support during this period.
