A preposition connects with a noun or pronoun to show its relationship with another word. Think: location, time, and movement.

Location Prepositions	before, behind, below, between, by, in, inside, near, on, over, through
Time Prepositions	after, before. during. from, on, past, since. to, until, upon
Movement Prepositions	against, along, down, from, into, off, on, toward, up

CONTEST Example CLUES Definition Clues

The word is directly defined in the sentence. Example: The <u>focal</u> point, <u>or main</u> focus, of the presentation is on the possibility of a school uniform.

Example Clues

An example of the word is given in the same sentence or following sentences. Example: The waiter offered the guests a few <u>beverage</u> choices, such as <u>water</u>, <u>tea</u>, or a <u>soft</u> drink.

Interence Clues

The reader must infer the meaning of the word using clues given in the text. Example: The <u>boisterous</u> crowd of teenagers were <u>asked to leave the movie theater</u>, so the other guests could enjoy the movie without <u>loud interruptions</u>.

Synonym Clues

Another word or words are used in the sentence that have similar meaning. Example: The <u>sturdy</u> desk was able to hold several hundred pounds due to its <u>strength</u>.

Antonym Clues

The word is defined when the text provides a word with the opposite meaning. Example: The gentlemen was quite <u>discourteous</u> to his guests. He had never been like that before. Usually, he was <u>polite</u> to everyone.
