**Super Second Grade Weekly Update: 5/7/21**

Second graders are working really hard on "third grade pacing." Boy, have they lived up to the challenge!

We will be doing our end-of-the-year assessments the last week of May so it is super important that distance learners and in-person learners are completing all of their assigned tasks, attending Zoom meetings, and attending school Monday-Friday.

Probably the two most important things that families can do to help prepare their student for third grade at this point is 1. Encourage them to READ, FOLLOW, and RESTATE DIRECTIONS and 2. Read aloud for 20-30 minutes every night. Let's keep our momentum going for a few more weeks!

While we are working really hard, we are also trying to find time for science labs, art/STEAM projects, music, pe, and time in the garden. This week, students used milk cartons, black paper, and sugar cubes to reinforce our understanding of weathering. In class we were able to make the distinction between weathering, which wears rocks away, and erosion, which carries the sediments away.

Next week students will be using paper towels, food coloring, water, and cups to follow a procedure titled "Walking Water Rainbow" as an extension of our reading on the Cano Christales River in Colombia, South America. It is a river that looks like a rainbow!

**Hello Families,**

What a fun week we had! Between math and preparing for Mother's Day students had lots of opportunities to get hands on this week.

In math students learned all about perimeter, they learned that the perimeter is the distance around the outside of a shape. Students got practice finding the perimeter of shapes when given the side lengths and when measuring the sides on their own. As a class we took this opportunity to go into our school garden for some learning. In the garden students worked together to measure the perimeter of many things including the perimeter of the whole garden, the planter beds, and the gate. We used both feet and inches to find the side lengths and then added all the sides together to find the perimeter. The perimeter of our garden is 164 feet or 1,986 inches! Next week we will use our measurement to find the area.



While in the garden we also planted a few tomato plants and sunflower seeds that were getting too big for our classroom windows. We are excited to see how they continue growing and eventually produce fruit.
