<b>ALABAMA GI DEPENDENTS' EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM</b>	Tuition, fees and book assistance to children and spouses of eligible Alabama veterans. Recipients may attend public institutions of higher education in AL and enroll as an undergraduate student.	Application forms may be obtained from the AL State Dept. of Veterans Affairs, P.O. Box 1509, Montgomery, AL 36102-1509, or from any county veterans service officer. Phone 334-242-5077.
<b>ALABAMA NATIONAL GUARD EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM</b>	Tuition, educational fees and books for students who are active AL National Guard members to attend a postsecondary educational institution. \$500 per term or \$1,000 per year. Is not based on need.	Applications available from AL National Guard units. Funds are limited, so students should apply early. A representative of the AL Military Department and the financial aid officer must sign forms.
<b>ALABAMA NURSING SCHOLARSHIPS</b>	Scholarship/loans of varying amounts awarded to students enrolled in eligible nursing programs at participating institutions. Must practice nursing one year in AL.	Applications are available from the financial aid offices at the institutions offering this award. Deadline dates vary from institution to institution. Applicants are encouraged to apply early.
<b>ALABAMA PREPAID AFFORDABLE COLLEGE TUITION PROGRAM</b>	Four years of fully paid undergraduate tuition at any public junior college, college, or university in AL. Age limits apply.	Contact the State Treasurer's Office, 204 AL State House, Montgomery, AL 36130 (334-242-7514 or 1-800-ALA-PACT).
<b>ALABAMA SCHOLARSHIPS FOR DEPENDENTS OF BLIND PARENTS</b>	Tuition and fees at an AL state institution of higher learning for families in which the head of the family is blind and whose family income is insufficient to provide educational benefits.	Applications are available from the State of AL Dept. of Ed., Administrative and Financial Services Division, Gordon Parsons Bldg., 50 North Ripley, Montgomery, AL 36130. (334-242-9742).
<b>ALABAMA STUDENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM</b>	Need based, state/federal grant ranging from \$300 to \$2,500 per year. Awards limited to undergraduate work.	Submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid form.
<b>ALABAMA STUDENT GRANT PROGRAM</b>	Up to \$1,200 in grant assistance – half-time and full-time students attending Birmingham-Southern, Concordia, Faulkner, Huntingdon, Judson, Miles, Oakwood, Samford, Selma, Southeastern Bible College, Southern Vocational College, Spring Hill, Stillman, and the Univ. of Mobile. Not based on need.	Applications are available from the financial aid office at the institution. Deadline dates apply.
<b>AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM</b>	Grant assistance for tuition, fees and board expenses. For sons, daughters, grandsons, granddaughters of veterans of WW I, WW II, Korea, or Vietnam.	Applications available from The American Legion Dept. <b>JUNIOR AND COMMUNITY COLLEGE ATHLETIC SCHOLARSHIPS</b>	In-state tuition and books for full-time students enrolled in a junior and community college. Based on athletic ability. May be renewed. Not based on financial need.	Contact the coach, athletic director, or financial aid officer at any public junior or community college in AL.
<b>JUNIOR AND COMMUNITY COLLEGE PERFORMING ARTS SCHOLARSHIPS</b>	In-state tuition for full-time students at a junior and community college. Based on talent. Not based on financial need.	Contact the financial aid office at any public junior or community college in AL.
<b>POLICE OFFICER'S AND FIREFIGHTER'S SURVIVOR'S EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM</b>	A grant for tuition, fees, books and supplies for dependents of AL police officers and firefighters killed in the line of duty. No limit on the amount. Available for undergraduate study. Other special eligibility criteria apply.	Applications available from the AL Commission on Higher Education, P.O. <b>SENIOR ADULT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM</b>	Free tuition for senior citizens (60 and over) who meet admission requirements for a two-year postsecondary college.	Contact the financial aid office at any two-year college.
<b>TWO-YEAR COLLEGE ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM</b>	In-state tuition and books. Based on academic merit. For students enrolled in public two-year colleges. Not based on need.	Contact the financial aid office at any two-year college.
