April Strevig started the meeting with the pledge. She then opened the meeting and welcomed everyone.

The first order of business was a review and approval of the Lake Joy Primary Bylaws and Guidelines for the School Council. April stated that we are required to review these annually. The Bylaws and Guidelines were reviewed and approved. Carly Bogen made the motion to approve with Candice Scott seconding the motion.

We reviewed the Covid protocols and procedures. All students are still in closed cohorts and we have classes in smaller cohorts inside of their cohorts. We have had some individuals quarantined, and we will continue to follow guidelines as they are released from the CDC. Dr. Strevig has also had our building sprayed with EcoVasive again to continue to protect the staff and students.

April discussed the school improvement plan and how wer are moving forward. We continue to focus on reading. The staff has continued to collect data from all assessments and is moving forward with targeted instruction. In December, teachers sent out a current reading level for all students and specific goals that they are working on to move towards the next reading level. Teachers are continuing to use Matching Books to Readers to pinpoint levels and strategies needed to move to the next level. Teachers are also looking at growth and making sure that we are just not trying to move quickly through the levels, but have a deeper understanding of each level of text and what students need to master that level. We will collect data from MAP again in January.

April also mentioned that we have an additional 45 students returning to in-person instruction in January.

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Spirit Day zooms continue to take place and the students and staff are excited about participating and seem to enjoy the new "normal".

The Santa Drop will take place a little differently this year to follow Covid procedures. This will be over zoom with a pre-recorded video.

Jodi Short shared how independent and responsible the children seem to be this year. That has been a huge positive seen throughout the building.

With no additional discussions, a motion to adjourn was made by Tara Hill. Jodi Short seconded the motion and the meeting was adjourned.
