Title I

What is Title I: Improving the Academic Achievement of Disadvantaged

- The purpose of this title is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at a minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments.

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- Title funds provide SUPPLEMENTARY educational services
 - These funds are targeted toward schools or students who need assistance above and beyond that which is provided through state and local resources.

Title I: Schoolwide Programs

- The primary purpose of a Title I schoolwide program is to upgrade the entire educational program of a school that has a high concentration of students from low-income families.
- A school, in which not less than 40% of students enrolled are from low-income families, is eligible to plan and implement a Title I schoolwide program.
- The Title I plan is updated and revised as student achievement data and needs change.

Projected Title I Expenditures:

Total Allocation: \$609,737.00

- Parental Involvement Set-Aside (1%): \$6097.37
- Homeless Set Aside: \$700.00
- English Learner Set-Aside: \$43,800.00
- Professional Development: \$11,000.00
- Other District Initiatives: \$30,000.00

Total Personnel: \$294,943.10

Total Set-Asides: \$151,788.00

Amount Remaining for Building Allocations: \$457,948.63

Title II Funds:

Title II, Part A program offers a wide variety of activities that can promote a teaching staff that is highly qualified and able to help all students -- regardless of individual learning needs -- achieve challenging state content and academic achievement standards. Funds can also be used to provide school principals with the knowledge and skills necessary to lead their school's efforts in increasing student academic achievement. Funds can also be used to reduce class sizes.

Andalusia City Schools Projected Title II Expenditures:

Total Allocation: \$80,419.00

- Portion of salary for class size reduction teacher at each school
- Professional development for administrators and teachers

Title IV Funds:

This program is intended to help increase the capacity of State educational agencies, local educational agencies, schools, and local communities to:

1. Provide all students with access to a well-rounded education
2. Improve school conditions for student learning
3. Improve the use of technology in order to improve academic achievement and digital literacy of all students.

Projected Title IV Expenditures:

Total Allocation: \$45,840.00

- School resource officer
- Safety materials and supplies
- Software for schools

Title V Funds:

The Rural Education Achievement Program (REAP) is designed to assist rural school districts in using Federal resources more effectively to improve the quality of instruction and student academic achievement.

Andalusia City Schools Projected Title V Expenditures:

Total Allocation: \$34,608.00

- Portion of Pre K teacher salaries

Parent Involvement Set-Aside

- Any LEA with a Title I allocation exceeding \$500,000 is required by law to set aside 1% of its Title I allocation for parental involvement.
- Of that 1%, 10% must be reserved at the LEA for system-wide initiatives related to parental involvement. The remaining 90% must be allocated to all Title I schools in the LEA. Therefore, each Title I school receives its portion of the 90% to implement school-level parental involvement.
 - 2020-2021 : \$6097.37
