Parent(s)/Guardian(s) of BCHS Dual Credit Student,

I am writing this letter in hopes to better explain our dual credit program. There have been changes to the program this year, and I would like to reach out to you so that we can all be on the same page in regards to your child's future. To begin, dual credit classes are classes we offer here at Breckinridge County High School that will count for credit both here at BCHS and at the partnering college. When it is time for your child to go to college, you can have the transcript sent from the partnering college to your child's college of choice by simply calling the Office of Admissions at the partnering college.

If your student is enrolled in any of the following courses on the next page, he or she is eligible to earn dual credit through the listed partnering college. Each course costs around \$56 per credit hour, so most courses cost around \$168 (except for Chemistry classes, as those include a lab which is an extra credit hour). Also, if your child is an 11th or 12th grade student, he or she is eligible to receive two classes free over his/her high school career. All your child has to do to claim these free courses is log on to his/her KHEAA account (the same website you would use to look up KEES money). The website is www.kheaa.com. We encourage you to go ahead and log on with your child to claim which courses you will be using for the scholarship. To log on to the account, visit the website listed above and click "Sign In" and "Need to Register". Please be sure to keep this information in a secure place where you can access it again.

If you do not feel that your family can afford to pay for dual credit classes at this time, your student can still remain in the class without getting college credit for the course. However, we strongly encourage families to seriously consider this opportunity, as this option is far cheaper than the cost of taking these same courses once your child is actually in college.

All students who are enrolled in a dual credit course, whether they are getting college credit for it or not, are required to watch a video provided by the Kentucky Department of Education. If you would like to also watch this video, feel free to view it at https://www.kheaa.com/website/kheaa/dual_credit?main=1. The website also provides more information if you are interested. We will be watching the video during school as well. Students who are absent on that date must see me to watch it at a later time, as it is a requirement from the state.
