








Hello families!

For next week, Wednesday is Veteran's Day. I will not be assigning work on that day. If you want to keep a routine going, you are welcome to have your students get on ixl and practice skills from their grade level.

The kindergarteners are doing so well working on words and sounding them out. Have patience as this can be a difficult skill and reassure them it is okay to make a mistake. The first grade are working on long vowel words with a sneaky e. Don't be afraid to quiz your child on long vowel words (five, make, mope, etc.) as well as sight words (there, were, where, the, I, etc.).

In math the first grade will be moving on into deciding when to add and when to subtract. This unit does include a lot of word problems. Kindergarten is working on numbers up to 10 and comparing them.

Please continue reading with your students at home at least 20 minutes a day. This can include reviewing words they are working on in class!

Hello Families.

November is here and with that came election week. As a class we listened to the book Grace for President by Kelly DiPucchio to introduce students to voting. This book also taught us a little about the electoral college which we explored further by looking at electoral college maps for the current year. We discovered Washington State gets 12 electoral votes! As a class we did some voting on things such as favorite food and sports.







This week took us into our 3rd chapter in math, understanding multiplication. Students explored the relationship between addition and multiplication. Students had the opportunity to use counters to solve multiplication problems on their desk. I am amazed with how quickly this year's class has grasped the new concepts that have come their way. Keep up the great work 3rd graders!

I challenged the class to each reach 100 medals in IXI and a few students have gone above and beyond. Those students are Grady who earned 22 and Jackson who earned 10 medals just this week! Way to go boys! In AR we have another student who has been working really hard this year and that student is Lilly, Lilly has already reached leap 4 this year. Way to go Lilly! Rember, now that students are in 3rd grade it takes 15 AR points to reach each leap.

#### Super Second Graders Weekly Update for 11/6/20:

#### Student SuperPower of the Week:

This week students continued to develop their Growth Mindset Super Power. This week's growth mindset mantra was, "I am a valued member of our learning community." This mantra was added to: "With effort, I can do hard things." "My mind is a muscle that grows!" and "Everyone can learn."

As your child is faced with obstacles in the coming weeks please use these mantras and our other Student Superpowers of: Respect, Responsibility, Good Judgement, Honesty, Self-Discipline, and Perseverance to help them get through hard things.

#### Conferences:

Conferences are scheduled for the week of November 9th. I am really looking forward to seeing students and their families so we can touch base and set new goals for winter. Please message me if you need to schedule a different conference time or if you would like to conference via Zoom.

A few things that set your students up for success are: 1. Listen to your child read aloud for 10-20 minutes every evening; 2. Work through one story problem together each day. Encourage your child to explain his/her thinking. Encourage your child to use evidence from story problems and passages to support his/her thinking; 3. Treat remote learning days as school days that begin at 8:30 and end at 3:00 with a 30 minute lunch and two 15 minute breaks throughout the day. This procedure keeps students caught up and limits the need to use precious evening family time for hours of "homework."

#### ELA and Math:

In ELA this week second graders worked with several of the steps in the writing process: plan, draft, and edit. They used a graphic organizer to plan and draft a story summary using key story elements such as characters, setting, and plot.

In math we have started our third chapter. This week, we focused on basic facts and their relationships. We explored ways to solve addition problems that used up to three addends. Some of these strategies included making a ten strategy and using doubles facts.

#### Science and Social Studies:

This week second graders read that sound can be described by its volume and pitch. We read that volume is the "loudness or softness" of a sound while pitch is how high or low the sound is. Things that vibrate quickly make high sounds and things that vibrate slowly make low sounds. Small forces make soft sounds. Strong forces make loud sounds.

In social studies we wrapped up our study of the electoral process! We will be looking at the history of Thanksgiving and colonial America for the next few weeks.

#### Epic/AR/and Fluency Reads:

We have read over 318 books on Epic and taken an astounding 127 AR tests! Keep it up!


Reading comprehension is essential to success in all content areas. Please ensure that your child is reading for at least 30 minutes every day. Have them read and test on the books that have been sent home to them in their learning packets. Then return the books at the end of the week so I can send a new set home the following week.

Also, please continue to time your child for 60 seconds as s/he reads the assigned weekly reading passage. Your child is not expected to complete the passage; rather circle the last word s/he read when the 60 second time is up. These fluency reads give me a really important, consistent data point to track growth and intervention. The time you spend ensuring these are accurate and turned in is greatly appreciated!

#### ixl:

Families, please help ensure your child completes his/her weekly "Recommended Skills." These are aligned with grade level skills and enforce grade level reading and comprehension concepts. The weekly ixl skills are also a wonderful tool to keep both our remote and in-person learners synchronized.

To get to the week's assigned skills students log into ixl. They will see the "Recommendations" home page. To the right of "Recommendations" students will see an oval with a yellow star and "Number Suggestions from your teacher." Click on this oval and work through the week's assigned skills.

Fabulous 4th Graders.... It was SO great to see so many spooky faces at our recent Halloween event sponsored by the booster club! Thanks to all who helped as well as those who participated.

It has been an action packed week for our 4th graders with applying our learned knowledge from the past few weeks in civics to our current presidential election and talking a lot about how our government works. In ELA we have been applying our writing skills to more in depth and detailed informational paragraph writing, including adding page numbers and quotes when using information from a source such as our reader, as well as indenting the paragraph and including a variety of details in a logical order. In Math, we have entered our mid chapter point and have identified a need for additional practice with multiplication and memorization of multiplication math facts - so we are encouraging our 4th grader to step up to that challenge and do some additional xtra math or iXL - math online whe at home, or practice their math facts in other ways whenever they can.

We are looking forward to meeting with families for fall conferences over the next week, and discussing how we can work together to continue to support student learning while on our current A/B schedule. We know this new schedule has been an adjustment for everyone, but we are seeing benefits and progress as we work together on it, so we want to build on that for the winter quarter. We know you will have many questions for us and we are eager to discuss those and brainstorm with you on how to solve any problems we identify together.

Special Calendar note: there is no school next Wednesday, 11/11/20 in honor of Veterans Day, so we are asking all of our students who normally come on Wednesday to attend on Thursday as a make up day if possible. Please confirm with us on Classdojo whether your student is able to make this change for next week only or not so we can plan accordingly.
