Graphic Design and Production

Course Number: 48.56200

This is the second year course in graphic communications and design pathway. This course focuses on the procedures commonly used in the graphic communication and design industries. Students will gain experience in project based lessons, creative problem solving and the practical implementation of those solutions across multiple areas of graphic communications. The prerequisite for this course is Introduction to Graphics and Design.

NOTE: This course includes a cumulative exam at the end of the semester which includes a written and performance exam that counts 20% of the second semester's grade.

Graphics Communications & Design - Course Description

These courses provide a professional gateway to the graphic communications field as it relates to personal communications skills and the professional employment. Each student will be guided in increasing their knowledge of relevant graphic concepts and procedures. Every student is responsible for their assignments and the proper use of equipment. This course will consist of performance objectives and hands-on lab assignments.

Everyone is required to keep an organized electronic portfolio which is graded regularly. It is not required to have, but STRONGLY recommended that you have at least a 4+GB flash drive. Electronics are tricky and, we have lost important information without notice and not had a way to back it up if it wasn't kept on a personal flash drive. This is YOUR responsibility. DO NOT SAVE WORK ON COMPUTER HARD DRIVES. SAVE ON CLOUDS OR FLASH DRIVES ONLY.

You will be working individually and with partners in this course. Google Classroom (GC) is where you will find all of my classwork this year.

Assignments & deadlines will be assigned regularly and they will be key components in your final grade average. Teamwork and mutual respect for each other's property is expected as they mirror the normal school & employment expectations that will follow your high school graduation. They will be calculated into an "employability skills" grade.

Google Classroom

To encourage blended learning, online assignments will be posted weekly through Google Classroom. At least one Google Classroom assignment per week will be graded and entered in Infinite Campus. Students should be familiar with how to navigate the online platform, communicate with their teacher, and submit assignments on time. If there are technology limitations, please notify the teacher.

If you are unwilling or not interested in completing individual assignments on a posted deadline, this <u>elective</u> class is probably not suited for you.

Successful students are mature, creative, and understand the necessity of following instructions and benefits of teamwork.

Being organized, exhibiting proper work ethics will impact your grade and any future career avenue you select.

Textbooks

This course uses a "classroom" set of textbooks. No textbooks are <u>issued</u> to individuals. Books may be checked out as required. Students are responsible for using these books properly and will be required to pay for their reimbursement if they vandalize the book. Replacement cost: \$50.00. This course also provides the use of an on-line textbook, Graphic Communications, 5th Edition, valuable for any homework/make-up work. All students must score a 100% on the safety and the measurement exams before they will be allowed to work in the lab. Linear measurement is the basis for all design & imaging work. Accurate measurement calculations are not a luxury. They are a requirement.

Re-testing policy: Students may re-take one assessment per semester, after completing tutoring/corrections, with the exception of county math requirements. No re-testing is allowed in AP courses, or for tests on which a student was found cheating. Additionally, a "re-test" cannot replace a zero for a task never initially completed.

The \$20 per semester lab fee (<u>you</u> create, produce & keep everything – think special occasions & portfolio contents) covers/personal projects. Students must pay for materials before producing any additional lab projects. Everyone using the lab agrees to follow computer guidelines and utilize lab tools & equipment with instructor's permission and discretion. If additional materials are needed for production, those may require purchase.

Expectations for the classroom:

- If an assignment is missed on the due date, a zero is put in the gradebook of Infinite Campus. It is the RESPONSIBILITY of the STUDENT to email me once they have submitted the assignment to Google Classroom to get credit for the assignment.
- Belongings (backpacks, lunch bags, water bottles, purses, gym bags, etc) will be left just inside the door of the classroom to alleviate clutter around the computer areas.
