#### **Commodores to Compete in Autonomous Vehicle Project**

Commodores will be working on an autonomous vehicle project that will engage them in an exciting project that purposely blends engineering, science, math and advancing technologies. Frazier High School was awarded an affordable and unique project focused on engineering, science and technology in an authentic, real world, leading edge focus, through a grant. This grant will link excellent teaching and learning practices with increasing corporate demands for skilled, creative and energetic employees.

Frazier's High School students incorporate innovation and creativity into their redesign of a "Power Wheels Jeep" to create an autonomous vehicle capable of various mission challenges relative to safe autonomous navigation. Each team will receive the vehicle and may spend up to \$1,000 solving the missions. Each design team is required to develop a plan to excite 100 younger students about engineering, science, and math around the IVD project in their school (Square One engineering ambassadors) and deliver the project prior to Competition Day. Only completed ambassadorship programs can be fully scored.

#### Frazier High School receives bow grant

Commodores can be expecting to learn the fundamentals of archery in physical education classes starting in the 2020-21 school year. The National Archery in the Schools Program is an in-school program aimed at improving educational performance among high school students. And through it, students are learning focus, self-control, discipline, patience, and the life lessons required to be successful in the classroom and in life.

Within the archery curriculum, units of study were written by Education, Conservation, and Target archery experts to meet state and national educational standards. This curriculum will allow physical education teachers to speak the language who intend on teaching core content throughout the school day. These units were designed for inclusion in a school's Physical Education curriculum and will be implemented within the high school's physical education classes beginning during the 2020-21 school year.

This opportunity has been provided from a \$1500 grant from the Pennsylvania Game Commission and another \$500 grant from the Easton Foundation.

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
#### Frazier High School Planning to Host VEX Robotics Competition

Plans are in the works for Frazier High School to host a VEX Robotics Competition in the 2020-21 school year. The <u>VEX Robotics Competition</u>, presented by the Robotics Education & Competition Foundation, is the largest and fastest growing middle school and high school robotics program globally with more than 20,000 teams from 50 countries playing in over 1,700 competitions worldwide. Each year, an exciting engineering challenge is presented in the form of a game. Students, with guidance from their teachers and mentors, build innovative robots and compete year-round.

In addition to learning valuable engineering skills, students gain life skills such as teamwork, perseverance, communication, collaboration, project management, and critical thinking. The VEX Robotics Competition

prepares students to become future innovators with 95% of participants reporting an increased interest in STEM subject areas and pursuing STEM-related careers.

The high school recently received a grant to purchase VEX rings, robots, and equipment necessary for the competition, along with donations from a GoFundMe fundraiser.






## MINI MAGAZINES - 5TH GRADE PROJECT-BASED LEARNING
