


#### AIDS CURRICULUM

As we get ready to begin our first year of a four-day school week, we want to thank you for your comments and cooperation. This innovative and flexible schedule change will feature many new & exciting opportunities for our students with Enrichment days, an after-school program, and the ability to implement character-centered curriculum with our students. Our school web site and future newsletters will continue to keep everyone informed.

# STUDENT IMMUNIZATION

Kindergarteners and sixth graders, please have your immunizations completed prior to school starting. These can be obtained at either your doctor's office or a pharmacy. The Lewis County Health Department is NOT giving immunizations at this time due to remodeling. Be sure and bring documentation on the first day of school.

### NOTES

Each student must bring a note upon returning to school after an absence. They will also need a note in order to be excused from class early for doctor appointments or pre-arranged absences, etc. Each student wishing to ride a bus or walk somewhere other than his/her normal stop **MUST** bring a note from home prior to any change. The school cannot write notes over the phone for this purpose, unless it is an emergency.

#### FOOTBALL GAMES AND SEASON PASSES

Football ticket prices will remain the same as last year. Season passes are available for \$75 per person. This pass allows you to enter all home games, including PWV Titan Football games played at Valley, Jr. High and High School at no charge. Golden Age passes are \$20 for age 60 and over.

#### **LEAD IN WATER**

In 2017, the Legislature directed the Washington Department of Health (WDH) to test for lead in the drinking water of all public schools. Before this mandate, we did our own random check of bubblers (drinking fountains) after the flood and the Town of Pe Ell water system update. Those checks did not produce any high measures. This spring, WDH was able to schedule a thorough test of our school water system. We received our results this summer. The threshold set by the state was 20 ppb (parts per billion) as needing action taken. Of the 45 sites tested, the results showed one bubbler above 20 (23) and three in class sinks (66, 24, 23) and two kitchen (dishwashing area) sinks (66, 33) above the threshold.

The first step is to remove any of the above that involve drinking water out of service. The second, to replace old faucets with new ones and retest. We are currently in the process of doing that. Most often new faucets rectify the problem. We won't allow any of these classroom sink faucets or the one drinking fountain to be used for drinking water until we have a retested with the new hardware and it passes.
