ONLINE RE-ENROLLMENT FORMS DUE APRIL 16, 2021

Registration forms can be completed online through ParentVUE. These forms need to be completed by the parent/guardian.. AZ residency documentation also needs to be included with the forms or can be turned in to the counseling office. (Copy of driver's license, utility bill, rental agreement, etc.). **Registration forms are due no later than April 16th so that students may receive their schedule this summer (mailed in July).**

SENIOR DEADLINES FOR ONLINE AND MCC CLASSES

Please note these important deadlines for all classes taken outside of Lake Havasu High School.

May 1st : Proof of passing all other online courses due to your counselor. **Official transcript(s) from other school(s) must be sent to the Counseling Office.**

Summer Options

There are numerous opportunities available for students to be engaged in activities over the summer. LHHS SUMMER SCHOOL

Summer School registration forms will be available April 1st in the Counseling Office. In order to be eligible for summer school, students must have completed their online registration and cleared all obligations. Summer school will use our online platform and there will also be some in-person hours required. There will be no cost.

Summer school dates are **Wednesday June 2 - Wednesday June 30**. This is a great opportunity to open up one extra elective option in the day, get ahead in Mathematics, or catch up with credit recovery! Incoming 9th graders are only eligible to take the Algebra 1-2 course this summer.

When is AzM2 given at LHHS? AzM2 testing dates are scheduled during 4th quarter.



PRE-REGISTRATION IN ENGLISH CLASSES

Counselors met with students (in English classes) to select classes for the 2020-2021 school year. Blackboard reminders were sent out for parents to review their student's selection through Synergy's StudentVue. Students must make all changes, via StudentVue, by **March 31st**.

During pre-registration, students were given copies of their graduation status report. Please ask your student about this important information regarding their credits and course selections based on their four-year plan and what they intend to do after high school graduation. If they want to attend a four-year university, make sure that they meet all the requirements. This reference guide will assist you as you guide your student to make the best possible course selections for the upcoming school year.

LHUSD has been evaluating the new CDC guidance and our most recent health benchmarks from the AZ Department of Health. Based on that information

We are excited to have fully opened beginning March 22nd for the 4th quarter.

The following mitigation strategies are in place and will continue to support a fully open status through the end of the school year:

Required face coverings

Available hand sanitizing stations throughout each campus

Extra sanitizing completed daily

Posted signage reminding to students and staff to socially distance to the extent possible

Circulation of outside air through our ventilation (HVAC) systems every 15 minutes

Chortling students to the extent possible throughout the school day

As we move to a fully open status we will need to collaborate to ensure our schools remain healthy learning environments. **Please keep students home who are experiencing any symptoms of COVID or if anyone in the household is awaiting a COVID test result;** this is the most important step in supporting our fully open status.

Students are not penalized for absences due to illness. We will continue to quarantine students who meet the close contact standards. There are new guidelines that waive quarantining for students who have tested positive for COVID within the last three months. Currently the number of required quarantine days is 10; however students who test negative for COVID on or after day 5 of their quarantine can return to school on day 8. Please make sure your school nurse has the necessary information to waive or release your student from quarantine.



As we reopen school full time, at home daily health screenings are more important than ever. If your student exhibits any of the following symptoms, please do not send him/her to school. Please help us keep school open!

At home daily health screenings

Students must not come to school if they exhibit any of the following symptoms

- * Fever
- * Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- * Cough
- * Fatigue
- * Headache
- * Muscle or body aches
- * Sore throat
- * Congestion/runny nose
- * Nausea/vomiting
- * Diarrhea



March 4, 2021- Second Annual HavaStartup 2020-2021 Business Plan Competition

HavaStartup is an annual competition organized by ASU at Lake Havasu in collaboration with Lake Havasu Area Chamber of Commerce and Better Business Bureau. The competition gives promising entrepreneurs an opportunity to turn their innovative business ideas into an actual commercial venture. ASU invited LHHS (Lake Havasu High School) Business Teacher/FBLA (Future Business Leaders America) Advisor, Ms. Denny and her students to participate in the HavaStartup competition.

Collin Livermore is a sophomore at LHHS and he is completing his second year in the CTSO (Career Technical Service Organization) Business pathway program. Collin is also an active member of FBLA (Future Business Leaders America). Collin was immediately interested when I introduced the HavaStartup annual competition. Students starting working on their business plan projects in the classroom the same time as the HavaStartup event.

Collin along with other competitors had a few months to prepare for this competition.

He participated in the required zoom online workshops and followed the competition timelines. He submitted his business plan summary to the judges for evaluation and feedback in November 2020. Collin was pleasantly surprised when he learned that his business plan qualified to move to the next round. ASU selected Collin's business plan as one of the three participants to present to the community through an oral Power Point presentation followed by Winner Announcement and Award ceremony on March 4, 2021.

Collin did an excellent job of presenting his business plan power point. He was articulate and showed confidence. When the judges asked questions, he was prepared and quick to respond. Collin was expressive and passionate about his business. He received accolades and positive comments from both the judges and other community leaders.

Collin's accomplishment was special because of his passion, young age and his commitment to excellence. It sets him apart from other students because he was the youngest entrepreneur to compete and it shows he is willing to try new things and take on new challenges.

The winner received a \$1000 cash prize and she was a student from ASU Havasu pursuing a bachelor's degree in business communications.

I am very proud of Collin Livermore. Collin gained invaluable experience by participating in this competition and it will serve him well in his future endeavors.

Advanced Graphic Design students create black and white self-portraits.

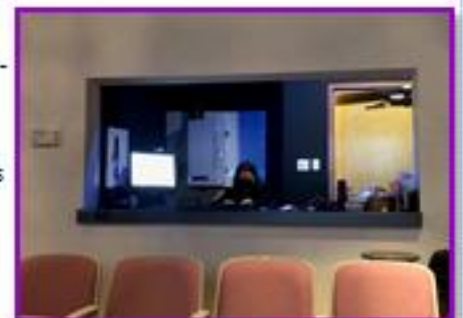
