Frequently Asked Questions:

Can deviations from the cohort occur?

Yes. Second year students <u>may</u> be able to swap out courses that are more relevant to the career that they are planning on pursuing. A student needs to request this opportunity by talking to Mrs. Smith. Cohort classes must have met the minimum number of students enrolled to be able to offer this opportunity. Any deviations from the cohort will result in the student purchasing their own books for the course.

How much do these courses cost?

Courses cost nothing to students who attend a Huron county high school at this time. At this time, textbooks do not cost anything either unless they deviate from the cohort.

Where are the courses taught at and by whom?

Courses are taught by MidMichigan instructors at the Huron Area Technical Center. Some are with in-person instructors, some are via Zoom distance learning, and some are online. Mid Michigan College strives to get inperson instructors as much as possible.

Do these courses transfer to other schools?

Per the Michigan Transfer Agreement, they should transfer, but it is always best to check with an advisor at the school the student intends to transfer them to and have them put it in writing prior to beginning. This will also help students determine which courses they need for their degree program. There is a transferability spreadsheet so all can see how these courses transfer to popular institutions in Michigan.
