Bears! Many people are fascinated by them. **(After)** all, who can resist a stuffed, **(cuddly)** teddy bear? Bear enclosures at zoos **(are)** often a popular exhibit. Watching adorable **(bear)** cubs romp brings smiles and chuckles **(from)** onlookers.

Use a flashlight at night. **(Be)** on the lookout for bear droppings. **(Do)** not set up camp if you **(see)** signs of a bear. Be especially **(careful)** if you see bear cubs. You **(can)** be sure that the mother bear **(is)** near. She might attack to protect **(her)** cubs. If you happen to come **(across)** a bear, do not run! Instead, **(back)** away very slowly. Use bear (pepper) **(spray)** only as a last resort.
