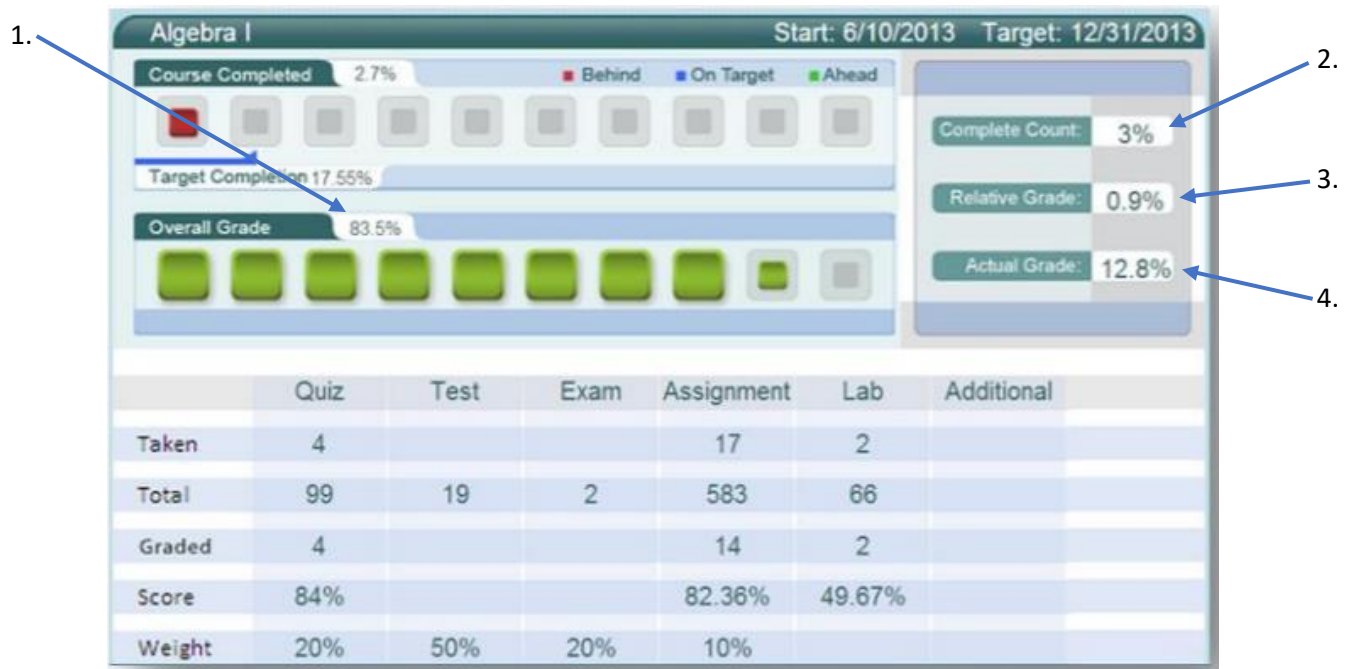


Understanding Your Student's Progress Report



1. **OVERALL GRADE:** This percentage represents the grade your student has acquired thus far in the course, based on all activities and assessments completed. This gives a good indication of how the student is comprehending the material, however it can be deceiving if the student is behind pace since this grade will be higher than the actual grade. The Actual Grade is the more accurate grade.
2. **COMPLETE COUNT:** The percentage of activities in a course that are completed.
3. **RELATIVE GRADE:** This percentage represents the grade your student has acquired thus far in the course but includes 0s for ALL work not completed from this point to the end of the course. This is the grade that would appear on the report card if a student does not complete a course 100%.
4. **ACTUAL GRADE:** This percentage represents the grade your student has acquired thus far in the course along with 0s for any work assigned to date but not completed. This is the grade we use on weekly updates in Home Access. This is the most accurate grade to look at on any given day.

NOTE: If a student completes a course 100%, all three grades: overall, actual, and relative should all be the same.

Example: The student above has an 83.5 on work that has been completed. Due to the fact they are behind pace and have only completed 3% of the course, their actual grade is a 12.8. If this student were to stop working in the class at this point, their grade would be a 0.9.
