Engaging Youth Through Engineering (EYE) is a workforce and economic development initiative created to bring relevance to the K-12 mathematics and science curriculum. The goal of EYE is to inspire, engage and prepare middle school students to take the coursework needed to support the growing demand for highly skilled and technology-savvy workers for major industries located in the Mobile area, including aerospace and shipbuilding.

- **EYE Camps and Clubs.** EYE camps and clubs offer engineering curriculum to fourth- and fifth-graders at 25 Mobile County schools. Students attend EYE clubs during the school year and then have the opportunity to continue the EYE program at teacher-led summer camps. EYE camps and clubs use the Boston Museum of Science “Engineering is Elementary” units and are led by trained teacher leaders.
- **Middle Grades Modules.** Funded through a grant from the National Science Foundation, EYE Middle Grades Modules are weeklong engineering units that incorporate science and mathematics. Each module is specifically designed to bring relevance and rigor to existing curriculum, with a special emphasis on mathematics. Each module also provides an engineering design challenge, fosters the development of “engineering habits of mind,” integrates technology and other resources to meet the learning needs of a diverse group of students, and deepens understanding of middle grades mathematics and science content.
- **Teacher Workshops.** One goal of EYE is to use the engaging work of engineers as innovative problem solvers to “hook” students at the upper elementary and middle grade levels so they will choose to take the higher level science and math courses and develop critical thinking and communication skills required for students to be either work or college-ready in the 21st century.
- **Engineering Pathways Integrated Curriculum (EPIC)** is a specialized math and science path that arms students to enter post-secondary education qualified for engineering majors, or other geotechnical, geological physical, meteorological, or environmental fields, as well as those interested in pursuing education majors in those areas. EPIC includes a strong math and science component. Interested students must commit to the required curriculum of

additional math and science coursework as well as enrichment activities.

- **MCPSS STEM Improvement Program.** In 2010-11, the Mobile County Public School System (MCPSS) developed the STEM Improvement Program in response to growing demand for all students to experience challenges that bring relevance to and integrate mathematics and science content, similar to those found in the EYE modules. Based on recommendations from the district's STEM Improvement Advisory Team, MCPSS decided to implement its STEM Improvement Program and STEM Standards initially at the middle grades, before expanding to the elementary and high school levels.

- Vital Link Week is a four-day program for rising ninth-grade students in Mobile County, and begins the second week of June.
- Purpose: Each year, a select group of rising ninth-graders and their teachers spend a week as interns in Mobile businesses to experience the importance of communication skills, mathematics, computer literacy, creativity, problem solving and teamwork. Students usually intern in groups of eight to 20. Their teachers help each business identify age-appropriate activities. A portion of each day on the job is spent as a group, with discussion and journal writing to help students make the link between curriculum and the workplace.

Back at school, teachers make the connection between their curriculum and the job skills experienced to help students understand the relevance of traditional classes, such as language arts, science and social studies. Students use their hands-on experience to help them select elective classes and make decisions regarding possible future careers.

Evening Educational Options Program, or EEOP, is a pilot program that began in 2009, initially serving 150 high school students, ages 17 years old or older. EEOP students are generally two or more years behind in high school, giving them only a 25 percent chance of graduating in the regular high school setting.

The primary purpose of EEOP is to provide accelerated course offerings through a computer-based curriculum that allows students to move at their own pace, along with intense social supports for students in danger of dropping out. The program works to help these students catch up to their peers, graduate with a high school diploma and be placed in a job and/or post-secondary training after graduation. The program takes place during evening hours from 4:00 pm to 9:00 pm, Monday through Thursday. The academic components of the school include curriculum, instruction and teacher hiring, all of which are directed by the staff of the Mobile County Public School System. EEOP is centrally located at Pillans Middle School. MAEF is responsible for developing and implementing the Career Development Program (CDP), which provides student support services to complement the academic components of EEOP. A staff of seven—including a Career Development Program director, post-secondary/job placement coordinator, internship coordinator, social worker, and three advocate counselors—provide a variety of services, including:

- Outreach and student recruitment

- Orientation and engagement
- Individual and group counseling and referrals
- Case management
- Extracurricular activities
- Youth leadership development
- Academic support and tutoring
- Business internships
- College exploration and advisement
- Preparation for employment
- Employment placement
- Support and guidance for planning for post secondary experiences

**Extended Learning Experience.** The RAMP UP Extended Learning Experience (ELE) helps students improve their academic performance by partnering with parents to create a roadmap to graduation. The program aims to elevate students to another ELE: Excellence, Leadership and Empowerment. It does this by:

- supporting rigor in the classroom
- increasing the relevance of academic content for students; and
- establishing supportive relationships between students and caring adults.

ELE is designed to support student achievement using individualized, intensive instruction supported by Compass Learning, including electronic diagnostic assessments for the delivery of a personalized learning experience.

- **Summer Transition Program.** The RAMP UP Summer Transition Program sets students up for success with opportunities to participate in self-examination, aspirations and goal-setting exercises, and to develop their high school and career

plan. Over six weeks, students in the program receive prescriptive and engaging lessons that target critical skill gaps in grades six through eighth in math that will afford them opportunities to advance to algebra when entering the ninth grade.

Early college/career culture enhancement sessions are planned for students and their parents for discussion on qualifications, admissions, financial aid and literacy, work student, scholarships, internships, fellowships, and hiring/interview process. At the close of the summer, students will present formal portfolios indicating their level of readiness and preparedness for their high school experience.
