Essential Understandings

- 3. Students will be able to explain why rules of behavior are required, and should be followed, no matter where you are.
- 4. Students will use proper grammar, sentence structure, spelling, and punctuation while developing a 2 page paper identifying the need to understand the requirements for social and behavioral requirements (Times New Roman in 12 font).
- 5. Students will use MLA formatting to reference specific content from both readings.
- 6. Students will key the document using a software program designed to do so.

- 5. Outline 3 consequences that can be taken when students/workers do not follow behavioral standards.
