New Scholarship for GCS Grads

Thanks to a generous anonymous donor, Guardian Catholic School is pleased to announce the first annual Sisters of Notre Dame Scholarship of Excellence. This award is named in honor of the Sisters of Notre Dame for their dedication and commitment to the education of Guardian Catholic School students for over 50 years. The intent of this scholarship is to give deserving eighth grade students the financial means to continue a faith-based, high quality Catholic education at Bishop Kenny or Bishop John J. Snyder High Schools. It will be awarded annually to multiple eighth graders based on financial need, school attendance, academic achievement, and distinction in character and Christian ideals. It is renewable for 4 years if awardees continue to meet these criteria.

Nine students have received the Sisters of Notre Dame Scholarship of Excellence Award. Those students continuing their education at Bishop Kenny are: Connor Chatman, Cornelius Wilson, Bruce McCord, Jamon Prince, Ny'Reon Shuman, Payne Thomas, and Robert Wilson. Those students receiving this award and continuing their education at Bishop Snyder are: Christopher Hills and Ron'na Turner.

Distinguished Graduates

This year marks the 10th year anniversary of the founding of the Townsend Scholarship. Named for longtime Guardian supporter and Board of Trustees member Ronald Townsend, the award is presented each year to high-achieving eighth-graders and provides them with a 4-year scholarship to Bishop Kenny, Bishop John J. Snyder, Bolles or Episcopal High Schools. The 2018 Townsend Scholar is Rachel Agbontaen, who will be attending The Bolles School this fall.

Payne Thomas is the 2018 recipient of the Carla Harris Award, a scholarship established in 2017 by St. Pius V and Bishop Kenny alumna Carla Harris. An accomplished Wall Street veteran, Harris was appointed by President Barack Obama in 2013 to chair the National Women's Business Council and was named to Fortune magazine's list of "The 50 Most Powerful Black Executives in Corporate America," among many other accolades. The endowment she created provides scholarships for African American students to attend Bishop Kenny High School.

Ny'Reon Schuman has been awarded the Bishop John J. Snyder Peace in Christ Award, given each year to a graduating eighth grade student who demonstrates the love of God by consistently exhibiting those virtues modeled by Bishop Snyder, who faithfully served the Diocese of St. Augustine from 1979-2000. The selection criteria include academic achievement, humility, community service, church involvement, and concern for others. Ny'Reon plans to attend Bishop Kenny High School next year.

The 2018 Sisters of Notre Dame Distinguished Graduate Award recipient is Ron'na Turner, who will attend Bishop John J. Snyder High School. This accolade recognizes graduates of schools affiliated with the Sisters of Notre Dame as being outstanding witnesses to Notre Dame education. Ron'na has also been awarded the Patricia Tierney Scholarship, established by the University of Notre Dame in honor of Pat Tierney for her exceptional leadership of Catholic Schools in the Diocese of St. Augustine and her dedicated service to the Alliance for Catholic Education (ACE) program.
