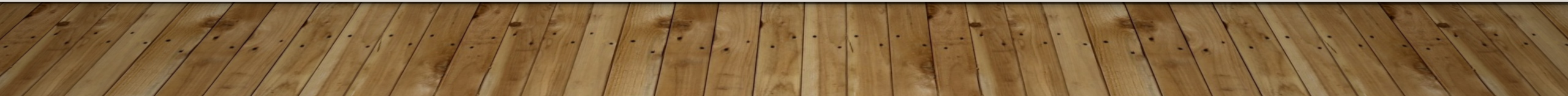


ANNUAL TITLE I MEETING



WHAT IS A TITLE I SCHOOL?

- Eligible for (neglected and delinquent children, homeless children and youth, foster care children, English learners, at-risk students, teenaged parents, impoverished students)
- Applied for and received funds to improve instruction so that student achievement of ALL students will increase.

HOW DOES OUR SCHOOL SPEND TITLE I MONEY?

- Instruction and supports
 - 1 paraprofessionals
 - 1 half-time teacher
 - 1 parent coordinator
 - Title I director
- Intervention Programs
- Professional Learning
- Supplies

HOW DOES OUR SCHOOL PARTICIPATE IN THE TITLE I PROGRAM?

- School improvement Plans-Posted on the district website
- Instructional staff and Support staff

- Ensure that staff works with all students to increase student achievement

- Report Cards
- GA Milestone Tests
- High School students test each December and May, depending on the class they are taking
- Elementary & Middle School students test only in May
- GA Milestone Tests receive grades of 1, 2, 3, or 4
- 1=Beginning 2=Developing **3=Proficient** 4=Exemplary

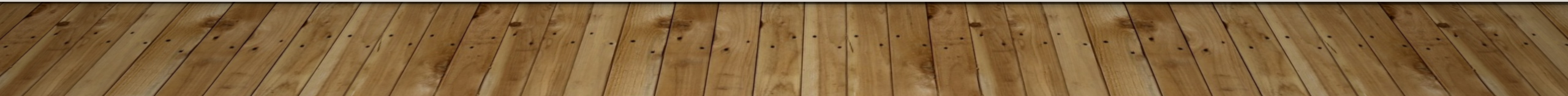

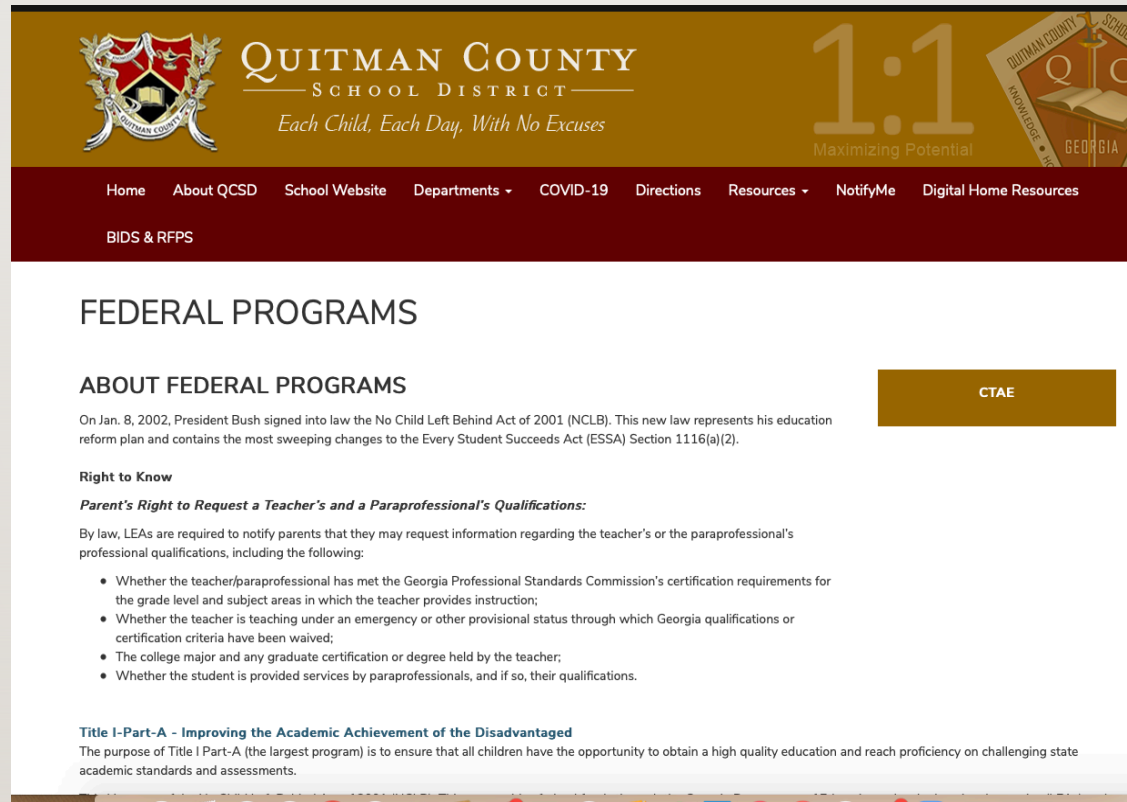

WELCOME PARENTS

While virtually all schools promote parent involvement, there are different types of involvement, ranging from encouraging volunteering and fundraising to providing parents with home-based learning activities. Joyce Epstein of the Johns Hopkins University, Center on School, Family and Community Partnerships, one of the nation's leading experts on parent involvement, has divided school parent involvement programs into six broad categories:

1. **Parenting**, in which schools help families with their parenting skills by providing information on children's developmental stages and offering advice on learning-friendly home environments;
2. **Communication**, providing to educate families about their child's progress and school services and providing opportunities for parents to communicate with the school;
