BADGE DESCRIPTIONS w/CRITERIA

Distinguished AFJROTC Cadet Award. This award consists of a certificate and a Distinguished AFJROTC Cadet Badge. This award recognized one outstanding second year cadet (third-year cadet in a 4-year program). Selection is made at the end of each school year. This allows the recipient to wear the award throughout the senior year.

The recipient must be of high moral character, demonstrate positive personal attributes, display outstanding military potential, and maintain consistent academic and military excellence. ***Recipient for KY-951 must accumulate over 200 hours of community service.***

The recipient will receive the following awards prior to selection:

-  **Leadership Ribbon**
-  **Achievement Ribbon**
-  **Superior Performance Ribbon**
-  **Academic Ribbon**
-  **Leadership Development Requirements Leadership Ribbon**
-  **Service Ribbon**

Aerospace Education Foundation (AEF) Academic Cadet Badge. Awarded to rising Junior and Senior cadets for academic excellence as signified by attaining an overall 3.3 grade point average with no grade below a “C” on their transcript. The individuals must be recommended by the **SASI**. OPR: Holm Center/JROTC.

Model Rocketry Badge. This badge is awarded to members of the Model Rocketry Club who have successfully completed all of the club objectives.

Awareness Presentation Team Badge. This badge is awarded to cadets who have participated in a minimum of three presentations to local civic organizations, school district officials, school board, and high school administration.

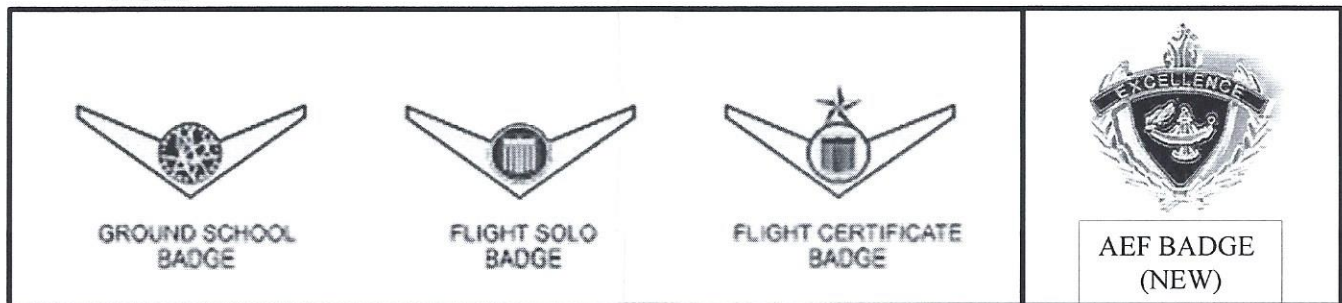
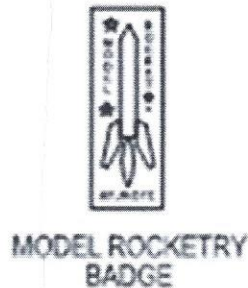
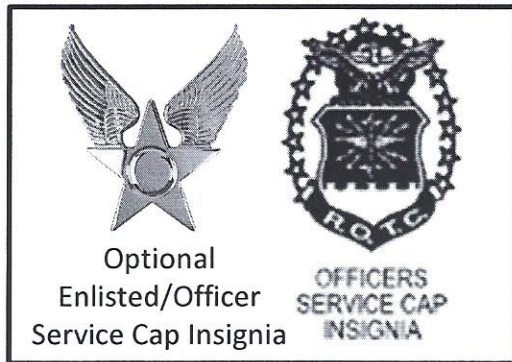
Kitty Hawk Air Society Badge. This badge is awarded to members of the Kitty Hawk Air Society who meet the required academic GPA of 3.25 (but decided annually by the SASI, to ensure at least 10% of the unit populace is able to join) on a 4-point scale with a “A” in AFJROTC. At no point will the GPA of this program fall below 3.0.

Marksmanship Badge. This badge is awarded to cadets that have successfully scored by the requirements of the “Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP)” All guidelines/rules are used by this established program. Cadets that participate in the Marksmanship program are eligible for three different badges:

- ✦ **Marksman** – Cadets shooting over 110 – 129 in the **“Prone & Kneeling”** positions.
- ✦ **Sharpshooter** – Cadets shooting 130 & above in the **“Prone & Kneeling”** positions.
- ✦ **Expert** – Cadets shooting over 230 in the **“Prone, Kneeling, & Standing”** positions.

Marksmanship competition awards/badges may be worn on the AFJROTC uniform. Males wear the badges under the ribbons on the left pocket flap of the light blue shirt or below the ribbons on the service dress uniform. Females wear the badges above the ribbons on both uniforms. Marksmanship badges will not be worn with medals.
