

APPLICATION *and* ADMISSIONS POLICY

Procedure

Please complete the following steps as promptly as possible.

1. Submit the application form to the school with non-refundable registration fees. Should the board not approve the application, the registration fees will be refunded.
2. Upon completion of the application an appointment will be made with the principal and a board member for an interview. (Please note areas of application that are mandatory.)
3. It is the school board that reviews and accepts or declines all applications.
4. The parents will be informed of the board's action by letter as soon as possible.
5. Registration will be completed. Arrangements should be made at this time for transfer of academic records. Homeschoolers: please refer to requirements on back of this page.

Eligibility

1. Oak Harbor Christian School exists primarily to educate the children of Christian parents who are committed to Christian education. In addition, Oak Harbor Christian School also provides a service to the body of Christ in the mission of Christian outreach.
2. Oak Harbor Christian School admits students of any race, color, national and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national and ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies, admissions policies, scholarship and loan programs, athletic and other school-administered programs.

Conditions

1. Attendance at Oak Harbor Christian School is a privilege. This privilege may be forfeited at the discretion of the administration by any student who does not conform to the standards and regulations of the school in practice or in spirit.
2. Students must be of suitable age for the grade assigned. Grade placement is determined by the administration and classroom teacher.

Interviews

1. The interview is an opportunity for both the parents and the Board to share information and expectations regarding the school and prospective student(s).
2. The parents will be fully informed of the philosophy, purpose, and program of the school and will be asked for their support.
3. Both parents and student(s) should be present at the interview if appropriate.

Enrollment Requirements for Homeschooled Children

Please submit any of the following information that you may have (for academic assessment for your child):

1. 2-3 Examples of written compositions from the past six months (e.g. letters, imaginative stories, reports, book reports, journals).
2. 4-5 Examples of math work - daily work and concept tests from the past six months.
3. Reading list: list of books and other materials read over the last year (e.g. magazines, newspapers, literature books, library books, Bible).
4. List of special projects completed. May have been alone or with family (e.g. photography, scrapbook, newspaper clippings, scrap book, research paper, science project, computer work, etc.).
5. List of field trips / socialization experiences (e.g. 4-H club, Sunday School, organized sports, etc).
6. Music and Art activities accomplished this year
7. List of Hobbies

Developmental Testing

All incoming kindergarteners will be required to take the N.I.L.D. (National Institutes of Learning Disabilities) "Search & Teach Evaluation", usually given during the first few weeks of school. This evaluation is very helpful in identifying areas of potential difficulty in reading and language. A \$20 test/scoring fee may be required on the day of the test.
