Arizona Teacher Openings Arizona School Personnel Administrators Association

- ► As of July 2020, there were 7485 teacher vacancies
 - ▶ 604 were filled by Long Term Substitutes
 - ▶ 800 were filled by having teachers work on a 6/5th contract (no planning time)
 - ▶ 70 were filled by paraprofessionals
 - ▶ 1037 were filled by an individual with an emergency teacher or emergency substitute certification
 - ▶ 800 were filled by an individual with inappropriate certification
 - ▶ 1057 were filled by an individual with alternative certification or a Subject Matter Expert

► As of January 2021, there were still 1989 teacher vacancies

ARS - 15-553

- ► Allows for the State Board of Education to grant school districts the authority to approve the certification of a teacher as a classroom-based preparation program provider
- School districts submit a program and training schedule along with any mentoring and coaching information to SBE
- School districts may partner with a third-party provider to provide training
- ► Teachers participate in this program for two years and students in their class must show annual growth
- ► Applicants must possess a bachelor's degree, fingerprint clearance card, and demonstrate professional and content knowledge as required by 15-533

ADE Requirements for Certification

- a. A bachelor's degree;
- b. Successful completion of a Board-approved Classroom-Based Alternative Preparation Program;
- c. Verification of satisfactory progress and achievement with students;
- d. Demonstration of subject knowledge proficiency with:
 - i. Verification of teaching courses relevant to a content area or subject matter for the last two consecutive years, and for a total of at least three years at one or more accredited postsecondary institutions; or
 - ii. A bachelor's, master's or doctoral degree from an accredited institution in the applicable subject area; or
 - iii. Verification of a minimum of five years of work experience in the applicable subject area of certification; or
 - iv. Three years of verified teaching experience in the same area of certification in which the individual is applying for certification; or
 - v. A passing score on the applicable subject knowledge portion of the Arizona Teacher Proficiency Assessment;
- e. Demonstration of professional knowledge proficiency with:
 - i. Three years of verified teaching experience in the same area of certification in which the individual is applying for certification; or
 - ii. A passing score on the applicable professional knowledge portion of the Arizona Teacher Proficiency Assessment;
- f. An individual seeking certification who was teaching courses or subjects tested by the statewide assessment must also provide:
 - i. Verified evidence of two years of full-time teaching; and
 - ii. Verified evidence that the individual's students performed at grade level; or
 - iii. Verified evidence that the individual's students achieved at least one year of academic growth at a rate equivalent to the state average for the students' associated peer groups;
- g. A valid fingerprint clearance card issued by the Arizona Department of Public Safety

► The LHUSD Bridge program provides a pathway for professionals with four-year degrees who do not possess a standard certificate to become a quality teacher and make a difference for Lake Havasu Unified School District students.

Goals/Vision

► The LHUSD Bridge program serves teaching candidates, parents, families, and students by expanding the quality teacher workforce, developing appropriately certified teachers for every classroom.





LHUSD Bridge Program Overview

- ► The LHUSD Bridge Program is a two-year program for certification with an optional third year focused on goal setting, professional reflection, and preparation for continuing teacher status.
- ► LHUSD Bridge Teachers will receive one week (40 hours) of training before the start of the teacher calendar. Teachers will learn about teaching and learning in LHUSD.
- ▶ LHUSD Bridge Teachers will participate in 7 after school training sessions (14 hours) focused on instructional fundamentals during year one. Teachers will learn the skills and dispositions required to be a successful teacher.
- ► LHUSD Bridge Teachers will participate in 7 after school training sessions (14 hours) focused on instructional shifts during year two. Teachers will learn how to apply LHUSD initiatives to their practice.
- ► Full-time coaches will support LHUSD Bridge Teachers. LHUSD Bridge Teachers will also be assigned to a site-based mentor. Site-based mentors and coaches have received training resources from New Teacher Center and are guided using the InTASC standards.
- ► LHUSD Bridge Teachers will successfully complete four teacher preparation courses at Mohave Community College within their first two years.
- LHUSD Bridge Teachers will receive job-embedded coaching and mentoring focused on modeling, observing other classrooms, videotaping, and reflection.



Program Evaluation - #2 Mentor and Mentee Data


1| Teachers are committed to students and their learning. Do you feel confident in implementing LHUSD's expectations for rules and delivery of consequences in the classroom?
