

Welcome to Tennessee History! In this class, we will learn about the foundation of Tennessee and important events, people, and places in the great state of Tennessee.

Materials Needed:

- Paper and Pen or Pencil
- Binder, notebook, folder, to keep your notes
- A Chromebook (provided by the school) or personal computer for the writing activities.

Types of Activities:

- Great Start / Reading Logs
 - * Each day you will be reading a short passage from the website <https://tennesseencyclopedia.net/>. You are going to complete a reading log each day about events, places, and attractions in Tennessee. A 10 point per day deduction will be taken for each day the log is not submitted onto Google Classroom.
- Notes:
 - * Each lesson, there will be notes to take. These notes will be the materials that will be covered for each test. All the notes for that unit will be digitally put onto Mr. Melton's Google Classroom account. Students will either complete their notes on paper. The code is: **mh3gy47**
- Tests:
 - * Test will cover a particular unit. Each test will be in the form of short answer. There will be roughly 10-13 short answer questions. Each question should be answered with 4-5 written sentences. Your reply should fully answer the question and have relevant details about the question from the lessons in class. These will be completed on paper.
 - You will either get:
 - Full credit for a full, complete answer
 - Have credit for a partial answer without all relevant details.
 - No credit will be given for incomplete, wrong answers, or answer with just 1 sentence
- Articles:
 - * In each unit, you will be reading an article related to the topic of study in TN History. You will be given 20 minutes to read the article, and answer questions and or write a summary of the article.
- Extra Credit:
 - * You may check out a copy of the TN Magazine and read an approved article, and handwrite a 2 paragraph summary of the article for 10 points added to a test grade.
