Introduction of Title 1 Part A at SCES

- The Elementary and Secondary School Act, Title 1 Part A, requires that each Title 1 School provide information to parents and families about Title 1 services.
 - Due to the recent Covid 19 pandemic, parents and visitors are not allowed in the building at this time.
 - This is to inform you that Spring City Elementary School is a Title 1 school as designated by the Federal Government.
 - You have rights and opportunities to communicate and be involved in your child's learning and achievement.
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What does it mean to be a Title 1, Part A school

- Being a Title 1 school means receiving federal funding to **supplement** the school's existing programs. These dollars can be used for
 1. Identifying students experiencing academic difficulties and providing timely assistance to help these students meet the State's Academic Standards.
 2. Purchasing supplemental: staff, programs, materials and supplies.
 3. Provide parent communication with their child's teacher through email, text messages, Remind, Dojo and Google Classroom.
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SCES Improvement Plan

- The Campus Improvement Plan includes:
 - A needs assessment and summary of data
 - Goals, objective and strategies to address the academic needs of students
 - Professional Development needs
 - Coordination of resources and services
 - Title 1 parents have the right to be involved in their child's academic progression.
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SCES Parent and Family Engagement Policy

- Provide opportunities to communicate with their child's teacher through phone calls, messages, emails, Class Dojo, Remind, Zoom, Google Classroom, Skype or FaceTime.
 - Provide timely information about activities going on in their child's classroom.
 - Provide parents with information about assessments such as: Iready, CASE, and TN Ready (spring achievement tests).
 - If requested, provide an appointment to meet with the teacher to discuss academic decisions such as supplemental services, (Tier classes, speech, or develop an IEP plan).
 - Title 1 parents have the right to be involved in the development of the school plan.
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School-Parent Compact

- The school-parent compact is a written agreement...
 - That addresses high-quality curriculum and instruction
 - That describes how parents and families, school staff and students share the responsibility for improved student achievement.
 - That stresses the importance of frequent communication between home and school.
 - Parent Teacher conferences are Oct. 28, 2020 and Feb. 3, 2021.
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Teacher Qualifications:

- Schools are required to notify parents that they have the right to request information regarding the qualifications of their child's teacher.
- Parents must follow the school procedure to request this information
- Check with the office to make this request
