

PHS AFJROTC Instructor Inducted into the USA Martial Arts Hall of Fame

Col Craig M. Lightfoot, USAF (Retired), the Senior Aerospace Science Instructor, Perry High School, was inducted into the USA Martial Arts Hall of Fame on September 6, 2015 in Forest Park, GA. He first started Judo in 1965 and Taekwondo in 1968 and either taught or was a student since. He studied both throughout the world and attained the martial rank of O Dan (5th degree black belt in Taekwondo) and San Dan (3rd degree black belt in Judo). A highlight of his career was being invited by the Kukkiwon, the cultural Center for Taekwondo in South Korea, to travel to Seoul, Korea for the 1988 Olympics along with the USA Military Taekwondo Team. Unfortunately, a military commitment prevented him from attending. However, being inducted into the USA Martial Arts Hall of Fame was his crowning moment in his martial arts career. Dr. H.G. Robinson, his original Judo instructor in 1965, nominated him to Dr. Jim Thomas, director and founder of the HOF. Once accepted by the



governing body of the HOF, he was inducted in September. He met Miss Kathy Long, five time woman's world MMA champion, and Professor Gary Lee, curator and founder of the HOF museum in Sugarland, TX. Professor Lee invited Col Lightfoot to be part of his museum as well as a martial art historian. PHS FFA Student has Grand Champion Steer at Georgia National Fair Junior Invitational Cattle Show








Adult Computer Classes Offered
