# Title I Goals

1. Increase academic achievement for all students
2. Provide direct instructional support for students
3. Provide additional programs, resources and staff to meet the needs of all students
4. Provide additional assistance to all students who experience difficulties in meeting the state performance targets
  - 44% of all students are proficient in English Language Arts and Math
  - 50% of all students are proficient in Science and U.S. History
5. Promote parental education and involvement

# 2020-2021 Title I Program

## What is Title I?

- According to the U.S. Dept. of Ed., the purpose of Title I funding is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high quality education and reach at minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments.

# Title I Program

- The basic principles of Title I state that schools with large concentrations of low-income students will receive supplemental funds to assist in meeting student's educational goals. Low-income students are determined by enrollment in the free and reduced lunch program. For an entire school to qualify for Title I funds, at least 40% of the school must receive free or reduced lunch. 100% of EMS students participate in the free and reduced lunch program.
